**Nature of Complaint:**

Before me, the undersigned authority and an investigator of the Louisville Metro Police Department's Professional Standard Unit came: [REDACTED] Who after being duly sworn, deposes and says: On the above date and time she was traveling northbound on the Gene Snyder, near the Anchorage exit, when Officer Wonka got behind her and activated his blue lights. [REDACTED] slowed her speed, activated her emergency flashers, and exited the Gene Snyder at the Westport Road Exit ramp. Officer Wonka approached her vehicle and yelled for her to show her hands out the window. [REDACTED] complied. Officer Wonka asked for her ID, then asked why she failed to pull over and she explained she did not feel comfortable or safe in stopping on the highway with her children in the car. Officer Wonka explained she still should have stopped then asked for her insurance card. Officer Wonka continued yelling, which made [REDACTED] feel scared, so she rolled up her window and requested another police officer come to the scene. She also explained she felt scared because Officer Wonka was in an unmarked car and she could not verify if the vehicle was really a police car. Officer Wonka banged on the glass, then pulled on the door handle, breaking it from the hinges. Backup officers arrived, one

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described as a white male, who spoke to [REDACTED] from the passenger window while Officer Wonka stood at the driver's door. Officer Brittany Gillock arrived shortly after and spoke to [REDACTED] from the front passenger door. [REDACTED] allowed Officer Gillock to open the front passenger door and then open the driver door from the inside. At which point Officer Wonka forcibly removed [REDACTED] from the vehicle, slammed her against her car, and placed her in handcuffs. She described the handcuffing as, "rough". She was then detained in the back of a marked police car. At one point Officer Wonka approached the police car and asked her is she was ready to talk now. When she declined he told her she will just remain in handcuffs, almost as if to drag out the detainment. Sergeant Matt Brown arrived on scene a short time later to take a report of the incident. [REDACTED] was then taken from the police car by Officer Gillock, and her handcuffs were repositioned to the front of her body. She was then walked back to her car. Sergeant Brown inquired as to why [REDACTED] was in handcuffs. He uncuffed her and allowed to sit in her car with her children, who were still in their car seats. [REDACTED] was issued a citation for speeding. She was also referred to OMB to recoup damages to her car door.
