On 03/04/2022 at approximately 0939 hours, I, Officer M. Rea responded to 3561 Devon Chase Rd., in reference to a disorderly child.

Upon arrival, I met with Ms. Cannon, who works with the Department of Family and Children Services, advised a juvenile by the name of "JJ" was refusing to go to school.

Ms. Cannon advised she has been trying to get "Mr. JJ" to get up and ready school for approximately two hours before she made a 911 notification.

I made contact with "Mr. JJ" and he was being very defensive and said "are you going to be cooperative?" I advised "Mr. JJ" that he needs to be cooperative and get ready for school.

"Mr. JJ" continued to stay in the bed and refused all directives given by Mr. Alber (foster parent), Ms. Cannon, and myself.

I stepped outside for my supervisor, Sgt. Wyatt.

Sgt. Wyatt got on scene and began to talk to Ms. Cannon about what law enforcement can and cannot do in reference to the situation.

At that time, "Mr. JJ" and Mr. Alber exited the residence and Mr. Alber stated "y'all better get him ("Mr. JJ"). "Mr. JJ" was in an aggressive fighting stance walking towards Mr. Alber saying "let's go we already outside". Officers approached "Mr. JJ" and advised him to calm down and get in the car to go to school.

"Mr. JJ" continued to be aggressive so I went to detain "Mr. JJ" and he began to resist officers.

The struggle led to the ground. "Mr. JJ" took my hat off of my head and began to strike me several times with it. While doing that, "Mr. JJ" started to kick Sgt. Wyatt in the legs.

Officers gained control of "Mr. JJ" and placed him in the patrol car and awaited for the arrival of South Fulton Fire Dept.

"Mr. JJ" vital signs were checked and given the approval to be transported to 5539 Old National Hwy., (South Fulton Police Headquarters).

Ms. Shakeina Rivers, the Intake Support Specialist advised not to place a hold on "Mr. JJ".

I obtained an arrest warrant for Simple Battery (X2) (OCGA 16-5-23), Obstruction of Law Enforcement (X2) (OCGA 16-10-24), and Simple Assault (OCGA 15-5-20).

I took "Mr. JJ" to Hughes Spalding Hospital to meet with his DFACS Councilor, Ms. Courtney. Ms. Courtney took possession of "Mr. JJ".

A case number was pulled, nothing further.

On 03-04-2022, I was dispatched to 3561 Devon Chase Rd. in reference to an unruly child call. Upon my arrival I made contact with an on scene DFCS case worker Ms. Courtnee Cannon (a) who advised she had a juvenile male who was refusing to go to school. The juvenile was inside the home upon my arrival. I did receive a phone call from an Officer on a different call seeking guidance in reference to an un related call. While I was on the phone assisting Cpl. Cooper, I did notice Mr. Eric Albert( ) who is the father of the juvenile exit the home shouting "yall need to get him!" I Immediately hung the phone up and noticed the male juvenile following behind Mr. Albert in an aggressive manor. The juvenile did pull his pants up and raise his hands in a manor that appeared he wanted to fight. I did instruct Cpl. Rea to place the juvenile in handcuffs for safety reasons. I did secure the left wrist off the juvenile with my left hand with the intent of placing his hands behind his back. The juvenile did resist by pulling his arm away and attempting to run. I was able to pull the juvenile to the ground but was unable to secure him in hadcuffs due to him pulling away. During the struggle, the juvenile was able to forcefully knock off my body camera and take it. I was able to remove it from his hand but due to the on going struggle I tossed it near by. I did advise dispatch that we had a resisting subject and to start a unit. I was able to get one hand secured in handcuffs but the other was underneath him. It appeared due to possible fatigue that the juvenile was no longer resisting. To prevent injury to myself, Rea, or the juvenile, I determined the best course of action would to be to wait for an additional unit to arrive before fully securing him in handcuffs. Cpl. Riley arrived and was able to place the juvenile in handcuffs without further incident.



On March 4, 2022, Ofc. M. Rea responded to 3561 Devon Chase Rd in reference to a Disorderly Child. Upon arrival, contact was made with a juvenile who was refusing to leave the residence. Currently on scene with officers was a Fulton County DFCS case worker. The juvenile was refusing to leave with the DFCS case worker and in the presence of officers attempted to fight his foster parent. As Sgt. R. Wyatt approached, the juvenile can be observed on BWC pulling up his pants and taking a fighting stance. Sgt. R. Wyatt and Ofc. M. Rea were able to grab the juvenile by both arms and take the juvenile to the ground. Once on the ground, Sgt. R. Wyatt advised that the juvenile was able to snatch his BWC from his exterior outer carrier vest. Sgt. R. Wyatt was able to remove the BWC from the juveniles grasp and tossed the BWC away from the juveniles' reach. Due to the juvenile struggling and refusing to give his hands to officers, Sgt. R. Wyatt and Ofc. M. Rea held the juvenile down until additional units arrived. Upon the arrival of Cpl. L. Riley, the juvenile was handcuffed and taken into custody.

Once at 5539 Old National Hwy, I was able to view Sgt. R. Wyatt's BWC. Upon Sgt. R. Wyatt approaching the juvenile, the juvenile can be observed pulling up his pants and taking a fighting stance. At this time, the juvenile was grabbed by Sgt. R. Wyatt and Ofc. M. Rea and taken to the ground. Due to Sgt. R. Wyatt's BWC being snatched from his exterior outer carrier vest, I was unable to observe any additional footage of the incident.

I also observed Ofc. M. Rea's BWC and he can be observed along with Sgt. R. Wyatt taking the juvenile to the ground. Due to the close proximately of the altercation, Ofc. M. Rea's BWC was blacked out and I was unable to observe what was taking place.

I was able to view dashcam footage from Cpl. L. Riley's vehicle upon her arrival. I was able to observe Sgt. R. Wyatt and Ofc. M. Rea holding the juvenile down upon the arrival of Cpl. L. Riley. Once Cpl. L. Riley approached, she placed her knee on the juveniles' shoulder and he was taken into custody. The juvenile at this time was partially in the yard and partially on the pavement.

I did observe a minor laceration to the rear of Sgt. R. Wyatt's right elbow and the back of Sgt. R. Wyatt's right hand. Ofc. M. Rea had a small scratch to the middle finger of his right hand. Both Sgt. R. Wyatt and Ofc. M. Rea refused medical attention. The juvenile had minor scratches below his left eye, to the side of his right eyebrow, his left wrist and right knee. I was advised

that the juveniles injuries came from when he went to the ground, he attempted to crawl away from officers and was dragging his body on the pavement.

Based on the BWC footage and statements made by both officers, I find that neither Sgt. R. Wyatt nor Ofc. M. Rea violated the South Fulton Police Department General Orders or Rules and Regulations. I recommend no action be taken against either officer.
