On June 15, 2020 at approximately 1950 hours, I Sergeant S. Hancock was called by Lt. Griffin who advised me he had a tip that a subject, known as Charles Dunwoody (B/M DOB) Kaiser (B/M DOB 1978) (AKA Cujo/ Kujo), was sitting in a wooden shack with several other black males, one of which was Carl (Bobby 1966), near the intersection of South Martin Luther King Jr Drive and West Sixth Street, and Dunwoody allegedly had several felony warrants, some of which Lt Griffin swore to himself, and was alleged to flee when dealing with law enforcement.

Lt. Griffin advised me Kaiser was supposed to be wearing a red in color shirt and Dunwoody was the only subject there in a black in color hat. I then called all Adel officers to the Adel Police Department and notified them of the information that I had received. We notified the Cook County Sheriff's Office of what we were about to do, asked for assistance, and went to the scene. Upon my arrival I spotted several black males, identified as Bobby Kaiser, who was in a red in color shirt as described, Ronnie Walton (B/M DOE 1979), and two unknown subjects sitting on the east side of the shelter, later identified as Gary Thomas (B/M DOB 1979), I made contact with Raiser, advised him of why I was there and walked to Thomas, at which time I identified as Gary Thomas (B/M DOB 1979), I made contact with Kaiser, advised him of why I was there and walked to Thomas, at which to asked if he had a license or ID card and he said no. I asked for his name and date of birth, after advising him of why I was out with them, and he hesitantly advised me he was William Tomlinson (DOB 1979).

Linstructed Corporal Sumner and Officer Brasher to gather information from the other subjects, who were sitting on the west side of the shelter, and while I advised dispatch of Thomas's information he picked up his phone and began to call someone. I asked Thomas not to call anyone to the scene and he said he wasn't but continued to make the call and even placed the phone on speaker phone. Corporal Sumner and I instructed Thomas several more times to stop calling and hang the phone up, due to the danger that officers would be in should a large number of people arrive on scene, but he would not comply and merely turned the speaker phone off. Corporal Sumner and I instructed him to hang the phone up and place the phone on the hand rail of the shelter they were sitting under but he still refused so I grabbed the phone, Thomas released it, and I placed it onto the hand rail and asked Thomas why he was having such a problem doing as he was instructed.

As I did so a large subject, who was at the opposite end of the shelter, on the north end of the bench, began to advise me that I could not tell Thomas to stay off his phone or prevent him from calling. As I spoke to the subject Officer Greene began to speak to Thomas. I heard Officer Greene instruct Thomas to place his hands behind his back several times and then I saw Officer Greene instruct Thomas to put his hands behind his back. Thomas would not comply with the orders Officer Greene gave so Officer Greene grabbed Thomas about the left wrist, continued to give verbal commands for him to put his hands behind his back, and Thomas began to physically resist Officer Greene by pulling his arm away from him and pushing Officer Greene away from him as Officer Greene attempted to place him in hand cuffs.

Because of Thomas's resistance and defiance my suspicions that we were dealing with the wanted felon, Dunwoody, became stronger. I attempted to assist Officer Greene but it was very difficult to grab Thomas due to my position, so I drew my department issued Taser and instructed Thomas to put his hands behind his back at which time Thomas pushed me back while he struggled with Officer Greene. I pressed my taser against the left side of Thomas's chest and delivered a drive stun in an attempt to convince Thomas to comply, but he continued to resist. A short time later Thomas made his way for the doorway and fell to the ground trying to get away. When he fell to the ground Sergeant Futch grabbed Thomas about the legs and held onto him, attempting to prevent Thomas from escaping. As he resisted Officers noticed that he was reaching his hands into his waist band, which made me fearful that Thomas may be trying to retrieve a weapon. As Thomas was on the floor I delivered several more drive stuns to his legs and shoulder area but he still would not comply. After determining that the drive stuns were not affective I holstered my taser while other officers subdued Thomas and I waited to jump in so as not to get in their way and so I could scan the other subjects for possible threats.

After Thomas was placed in hand cuffs he made complaints that his wrist was injured so I instructed Corporal Sumner to call for EMS. While waiting for Ems to arrive I began searching Thomas's false name through GCIC and NCIC to see if he had in fact given me the correct information. I sat my computer on the shelter hand rail to check the information and as I did so I noticed a small clear plastic container with a red in color lid on the rail next to my computer. As Hobserved the contents I noticed several clear baggies containing what appeared to be cocaine. Lasked officers if they noticed it there and Corporal Summer advised me that container was what Thomas retrieved from his waist band. Afterward he threw the container onto the ground near the shelter and she picked it up. As I looked onto the shelter floor Corporal Sumner then advised me there was a clear bag of green leafy substance under the bench that the other subjects were sitting on, closer to the north side of the bench.

Afterward I heard Officer Greene and Sergeant Futch instructing Thomas to get in the patrol vehicle. As they gave verbal commands I could hear Thomas being verbally defiant and refusing to get in the vehicle while also advising bystanders that he had been abused and beaten by law enforcement. I walked to Thomas and instructed him to get in the vehicle, advising him that if he did not comply (get in the vehicle) we would be forced to place him in the vehicle which could result in more physical control and force used on him and a short time later he sat in the rear seat of my patrol vehicle. Because I saw the suspected marijuana where it was located I began to look around for the subject that was sitting nearest to that seat and I realized that he and Kaiser had both left the scene. Lasked other officers if they knew where they were and they said no. While trying to work the incident and gather necessary information a large crowd of people began to gather and began walking onto the scene. I advised several of them that the area was an active crime scene and instructed them to leave but only some of them would comply. The crowd became more and more angry claiming we had beaten Thomas which made it more and more difficult to conduct my investigation.

Because the crowd was growing the way it was officers asked if they could transport Thomas to the Cook County Sheriff's Office so that the scene would clear out but as they began to leave with him EMS arrived. Shortly after their arrival we decided that EMS would follow the officers to the Cook County Sheriff's Office and he would be evaluated there for officer and EMS safety issues. I retrieved all of the evidence/ contraband recovered from the scene and asked Walton and the unknown subject if the substances belonged to them or if they knew the subject that walked away and they said no. Because I did not see the subjects lay the substance down I decided to review body cam footage from all officers present prior to making a charge on the subjects for being in possession of it so I advised them they were free to leave the scene and I advised all officers that I was leaving the scene

Upon my arrival at the Cook County Sheriff's Office Thomas was being observed by EMS. As they checked Thomas's wrist I asked what his name was and he advised me he was Gary Tomlinson so I advised him he told me first that he was William Tomlinson and asked why he lied. Thomas advised me he never gave me a name and stated he only said that he was not Charles Durwoody. A short time later EMS advised him they did not see any injuries to his wrist and advised him it was up to him and law enforcement wether he was seen at a hospital or not.

A short time later I asked Thomas if he still wished to go to the hospital and he said yes so I attempted to call Chief Chad Castleberry but he did not answer. I called Lieutenant Griffin to ask him what they would wish for me to do and as I did Thomas advised Sergeant Futch that he did not wish to be

taken to the hospital and asked if the jail staff would merely give him a Tylenol for his pain so Lieutenant Griffin advised me to turn him over to the jail staff

Because Tomas gave false names I instructed the jail staff not to release Thomas until his finger prints returned to verify his identity.

Thomas was turned over to the jail staff to await warrants.

When Sergeant Futch and Lexited the jail Thomas's father was standing near the sally port where I parked my patrol vehicle so Lasked if I could help him and he angrily instructed me not to speak to him and advised me he was within his rights to be there. I advised him I was not disputing that and explained that I was merely asking if he needed something that I could help him with. At that time two more female subjects approached us and began asking questions as to what happened and I did my best to advise them of what took place from my perspective. During the conversation Sergeant Futch asked them what Thomas's name was and they advised us he was Gary Thomas Jr. They advised me they wished to see the body camera footage of the incident so I advised them they would have to make their request with the Chief of Police the following day.

My BWC was not active for this investigation due to the battery being dead. I did not notice this until the incident was over.

On Monday, June 15, 2020 at approximately 1900 hours, myself and all other Adel PD officers on duty were advised by Sgt. Hancock to meet at the police department.

Upon meeting with Sgt. Hancock, he advised that Lt. Griffin advised him that an FBI agent passed on a tip that a subject (nickname "Kujo") was at the intersection of S Martin Luther King Jr Dr and W Sixth St, Adel, Ga 31620. The subject was described as a black male with a black hat. We were advised he was the only subject with a hat on in a brown shack with several other males. We were advised he had several felony warrants. I called Sgt. Godwin with Cook County Sheriff's Office and requested their assistance since we were told that this subject would likely run. The agreed and stated they would meet us there.

While we were in route to this location, Sgt. Hancock advised it was Charles Dunwoody who we were going to be attempting to make contact with. I was familiar with this subject's warrants due to a search warrant we had previously done at one of his known residences in the past (case # 20-03-00016). Once we arrived on scene, Sgt. Hancock and Ofc. Greene walked up on the gazebo to make contact with the male subject wearing the hat. Sgt. Hancock spoke with him and asked him for his information and instructed me to get the names of the subjects on the west side of the gazebo. The name that Sgt. Hancock ran through dispatch did not return on GCIC. While speaking with the other males (Walton, Ronnie 1979 & Walton, Randai 1977), I heard Sgt. Hancock instructing the male he was speaking with (later identified as Gary Thomas) to hang up the phone and not to call anyone. I noticed he did not put the phone down when Sgt. Hancock told him, so I again instructed him to hang up the phone. Myself and Sgt. Hancock told him multiple times to put the phone down and he refused. Sgt. Hancock instructed Thomas to turn the phone off and put it on the rail and again Thomas refused to comply with instructions.

During this time, another male on the west side of the gazebo got verbally agitated because we were instructing Thomas to hang up the phone. This other large black male wearing a black shirt (Ofc. Brasher identified this subject) stood up and told us we couldn't make Thomas hang up the phone. I turned to him and gave him multiple instructions to sit back down. While I was speaking to this male, Ofc. Greene and Sqt. Hancock were attempting to detain Thomas into handcuffs.

Thomas was actively resisting arrest and I could see officers were struggling to detain him. I went to assist with detaining Thomas. When I did, I observed taser lights on his torso area and waited just a moment before going hands on. Once I didn't see the lights, I began to try and pull his arm around to his back side. Thomas continued to pull his arm away from me and put it under his body when he was laying on the ground. He turned his body on his back and then back around to his stomach more than once while continuing to reach toward his waist band. While he was doing this and pulling away, I witnessed Thomas toss a small, clear plastic container with a red lid under the gazebo. The container had something white in it which I believed to be narcotics of some sort. I grabbed the container and tossed if out of the way to avoid evidence potentially being destroyed. Even after Thomas tossed the container, he continued to reach for his waistband, feading me to believe he could possibly be reaching for a firearm or some other weapon. Linstructed Thomas to put his hands behind his back as we continued to try to turn him to his stomach.

Sqt. Futch instructed me to get my handcuffs and we were able to pull Thomas' right arm around to the back and I was able to get one cuff on. After other officers got the other cuff on, I got up to secure the container that I tossed.

Thomas made a complaint that the cuffs were hurting him and I advised him if he would calm down we would adjust them for him. He was escorted to the patrol car by officers and I stood by with Sgt. Hancock to assist him in trying to identify Thomas. Thomas continued to complain about his wrist hurting and at that time, I called EMS to come and evaluate him. The crowd in the area continued to grow larger and larger and family members of Thomas began to arrive on scene. Due to his incompliance at the time of his detainment and the crowd growing so rapidly, we asked EMS to meet us at the Cook County jail to evaluate Thomas. Thomas was removed from Sgt. Hancock's car and placed into mine for transport. As soon as I arrived at the LEC with Thomas, he was immediately transferred to EMS care. Thomas was released from EMS care to the jail staff.

My Watch Guard body/dash cameras were activated during this entire incident.

On June 15, 2020 at approximately 1900 hours I, Sergeant Futch, was called by Sergent Hancock and advised to meet at the Adel Police Department. He advised me that Lieutenant Griffin advised him that the FBI had a tip that a subject, known as Charles Dunwoody also known as Kujo was sitting in a wooden shack near the intersection of South Martin Luther King Jr Drive and West Sixth Street wearing a black shirt and a dark ball cap. He was supposed to be the only one wearing a dark ball cap. Dunwoody had several felony warrants, and we were advised he was known to flee when dealing with law enforcement.

Corporal Sumner asked if she needed to notify the Cook County Sheriff's Office and ask for assistance for what we were about to do and I advised her to do so. At this time all Adel Police Department units followed Sergeant Hancock to the scene. I parked my patrol car and moved to the far South West corner of the property. I checked the shed from a back window and made sure the shed was clear. While I was helping hold the perimeter Sergeant Hancock, Corporal Sumner and Officer Greene approached the males on scene inside a gazebo and began to identify them. I held the perimeter until I heard Sergeant Hancock and Officer Greene continue to tell a black male with a dark ball cap on and black shirt to stop calling people on his cell phone. This order was given to the man, later Identified as Gary Thomas 199, several times and he continued to grab his cell phone and attempt to make contact with people not on scene. I approached and took the cell phone off the banister and placed it on Officer Greene's patrol car in an effort to remove the problem and deescalate the situation. As I placed the phone on the car I could hear Officer Greene order Thomas to stand up and put his hands behind his back. Thomas began to resist officers attempting to detain him and I reached over the banister to assist.

After Thomas continued to resist Liet him go and ran onto the gazebo in order to better my position to gain control of Thomas. At this point Thomas was swinging his arms and kicking at officers. I grabbed Thomas's legs and pulled him to the floor applying pressure to his legs to prevent escape of further injury of any party. After several seconds I noticed on open position on Thomas's back where I could help assist officers trying to cuff Thomas. While holding his legs Thomas had continued to kick me in the chest. I moved forward where I attempted to gain control of Thomas. Thomas continued to reach for his waist band and there was a fear he was going to a weapon. I was able to gain control of Thomas's right arm and had Corporal Sumner cuff it. I then took control of Thomas's left arm and brought it up to where Deputy Gatewood was able to assist me in cuffing Thomas. Thomas was searched after being cuffed and some money and a small amount of marijuane was found by me in his right pocket.

After Thomas was placed in hand cuffs he made complaints that his wrist was injured so EMS was called. Officer Greene and I adjusted the cuffs on Thomas to give him more room. Officer Greene and I then instructed Thomas to get in the patrol vehicle. Thomas was verbally defiant and refused to get in the vehicle. Thomas was yelling to a now formed crowd that he had been abused and beaten by law enforcement. After a short time we were able to get Thomas to sit in the back of Sergeant Hancock's patrol vehicle. A large crowd was growing and becoming agitated so it was decided to take Thomas to the Cook County Sheriff's Office where EMS would check him a safe and secure location. I stayed until all evidence was secured and officers were leaving the scene to follow Thomas to the Cook County Jail.

At the jail Thomas was observed by EMS and they advised him they did not see any injuries to his wrist. Thomas stated that he did not wish to be taken to the hospital and asked if he could just have a Tylenol.

Thomas was turned over to the jail staff to await warrants

My body cam was active for this incident.

On June 15th, 2020 around 1900 hours, Sqt. S. Hancock advised all Adel units to meet at the Police Department.

Once at the Department, Sgt. Hancock advised us Lt. C. Griffin called him in reference to a subject who was wanted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). The only information we were given was the subject had outstanding Felony warrants for trafficking Cocaine, and several other felony drug related offenses. The subject we were looking for was said to be sitting under a shack at S. Martin Luther King Avenue between West 6th and 7th Street. It was also said that the Wanted subject was sitting with a group of black males and was said to be wearing a black hat, and was the only one with a hat on. We were also advised the subject would run. This was the only information we were given. This area is a well known drug area and I was sure there would be weapons involved.

Let it be known my department issued body camera was dead during this briefing and only charged for a few brief moments on the way to the scene.

While we were enroute, Sgt. Hancock advised us he was told the subject we were looking for was a Charles Dunwoody (unknown DOB or picture at the time). Once we turned on South Martin Luther King Dr. I activated my in car camera as well as my body camera. Myself Sgt Hancock, Sgt. Fulch, Cpl. Sumner, Officer Brasher, Sgt. Godwin (K9) and deputies Gates, Gatewood, and Brewer all arrived on scene at the same time. The Cook County Sheriff's Deputies were all called for assistance in case of the subject fleeing or an altercation breaking out with the amount of people on scene. All of the Deputies including Ofc. Brasher and Cpl. Sumner, parked, and approached from the North end of the yard from West Sixth Street. Myself, Sgt. Hancock, and Sgt. Futch turned into the yard beside the shack where the group was sitting. I pulled my car in directly in front of the East end of the shack where my in-car dash camera would also record the incident. As I pulled up and exited my vehicle I smelled the strong odor of Marijuana emitting from the area around the shack. At that point one unknown black male, wearing a red shirt and red hat, stood up and walked out from under the shack and started south across the yard. I advised him to go sit back down, fearing he was about to flee, and he continued walking south towards Sgt. Hancocks vehicle. Sgt Hancock made contact with the subject so I turned my attention back to the group of people. I noticed another black male sitting at East most corner of the shack wearing a dark blue Atlanta Braves Hat which from afar could appear to be black. I asked him what his name was and he stated Mikey. I continued to walk up to the shack and asked the group where Charles was. Someone eventually spoke up and asked who, and said they didn't know him. I then let Sgt. Hancock step up and continue to question the subjects.

Sgt. Hancock began questioning "Mikey", I then asked the male who stood up first to come sit back down again which he complied. Sgt Hancock got "Mikey's" name and DOB through dispatch. Mikey told Sqt. Hancock his name was William Tomlinson. (((It was later found out at the Cook County Jail Tomlinson's real name was Gary Thomas (DOB 1979))). Sgt. Hancock advised Ofc. Brasher and Cpl. Sumner to get the other subjects names and DOB's. Sgt. Hancock then advised Thomas why we were out with him and who we were looking for. Thomas then picked up his phone and started to call someone. Sgt. Hancock asked him multiple times to please stay off of the phone. Cpl. K. Sumner also asked him to hang up the phone. Thomas continued to try and call someone and would not listen. Sgt. Hancock again asked Thomas to turn it off and place his phone on the railing. Thomas was acting very nervous, and was apprehensive which raised my suspicion as to what his intentions were. A short time later Dispatch advised they got no return on the name he ran. Based on this and Thomas's behavior I believed he was giving Sgt. Hancock a false name and DOB.

Based on my training and experience, we do not allow subjects to be on their phone white being questioned, detained, or while they are under arrest, or whatever the case may be for the contact, unless it is needed. This is due to Officer Safety precautions. After being asked to turn it off, Thomas held the phone up and continued to text on it and ignored Sgt. Hancocks instructions which further impeded our investigation and caused a concern for Officer Safety. Sgt Hancock did advise Thomas if he did not put the phone down he would be placed in handcuffs. A subject from the other side of the shack spoke up which made Sqt. Hancock also point his attention elsewhere. Thomas picked up his phone again, I advised Thomas to put the phone down again, or he would be placed in handcuffs. At that time it began ringing. Thomas appeared to answer the phone and at that time I took it from him and placed it on the railing. Sgt Futch then walked up and tried to reason with Thomas, but he continued to argue about his phone and his name. As the phone continued to ring I tried to reason with Thomas as well but he then tooked at phone, quickly grabbed it, and answered the phone call.

I took the phone from Thomas and placed it on the railing and told him to put his hands behind his back as I grabbed his left arm. Thomas immediately tensed up and began pulling away. Thomas grabbed onto the railing as Sgt. Hancock tried to grab his right arm. He then stood up as he continued to resist, pulling away, and pushed Sgt. Hancock back, as Sgt. Hancock deployed his Taser. Thomas then sat back down on the bench and held onto the railing. Myself and Sgt, Hancock continued to give verbal commands to put his hands behind his back as he delivered a drive stun from his taser to his upper left shoulder. Thomas continued to fight and pull away as he fell towards to doorway of the shack. Sgt. Futch and I grabbed Thomas and tried to keep him on the ground, I gave him verbal commands to put his hands behind his back. then observed Thomas reaching for his wasteband. Thomas continued to resist and would not comply with verbal commands when I could hear Sgt. Hancock delivering another drive stun from his taser. Thomas began to scream as he fought back towards his wasteband. I began yelling at other officers that he was reaching for his waste. I could not tell what he was grabbing for but was fearful it was a weapon. I lost all control of Thomas's left arm and as it came back up from his stomach I delivered a strike to the back of his arm. I then delivered a knee strike, to his left side to try and gain compliance.

Thomas then rolled over and appeared to have reached further down into his wasteband. Thomas continued to resist. Sgt Hancock gave another drive stun to Thomas's back and tased me in the arm. At that point, still fearful of him grabbing a weapon, I delivered an elbow strike to his right jaw. Thomas then grabbed a hold of my arm with a tight grip and would not let go, he continued to roll about. I could hear Sgt. Futch continuing to yell for Thomas to stop reaching for his wasteband so I delivered another strike to the right jaw, this time with a closed fist, telling him to let go of my arm. I then gave him verbal commands to put his hands behind his back. Deputy

Gatewood also attempted to subdue Thomas legs so he would quit kicking. Thomas lost his grip on my arm but continued to pull his arm away. As I continued to try and wrestle Thomas's arm behind his back, he sat up, and I believed he tried to bite my left arm. I pulled my arm away for a moment, and tried again to grab his left arm to regain control. He again sat up and his mouth brushed by my arm, he laid his head on the ground. I then held the top of Thomas's head to the ground for a moment to keep him from trying to bite. I told Thomas not to bite me and he started yelling he did not bite me. Sgt. Futch finally was able to get his hands behind his back. Cpl. Sumner Sgt. Futch and Deputy Gatewood were able to handcuff Thomas. Myself and Sgt. Futch then tried to calm Thomas down so we could search his wasteband for weapons. He continued to reach for his waste now on his backside. I told Sgt. Futch and Deputy Gatewood to check his wasteband. I heard Sgt. Futch state Thomas had kicked him multiple times and his arm was scratched all up. Thomas was stood up and a search of his person was conducted incident to arrest. I located cash in his front left pocket with a pack of cigarettes. Sgt. Futch located a small baggie of a green leafy substance in his front right pocket. No weapons were found on his person.

Thomas was then escorted to Sgt. Hancocks car. Thomas made multiple statements that his hands were hurt and the cuffs were too tight. I observed the cuffs were not properly on his wrist and told Sgt. Futch that I was going to adjust him. We advised Thomas to calm down and calmed him down long enough that I was able to recuff him correctly. I told Thomas not to Buck and Sgt. Futch advised him not to continue to fight as well. The cuffs were checked for fit and double locked. Myself and Sgt. Futch tried to talk Thomas to sit into the back of the car and he would not comply. Thomas sat down at one point and then stood back up out of the car. Sgt. Hancock also told Thomas to sit in the vehicle and he would not comply until Sgt Hancock threatened to use force again for compliance. Thomas finally sat down in the vehicle and the door was closed. EMS was immediately called to check Thomas out. I then returned to the shack to secure Thomas's belongings. I picked up Thomas's money and placed it on the railing with his other belongings. Sgt. Hancock advised us there was a bag of weed in the shack and I attempted to locate it but could not find it. Cpl. Sumner also handed me a clear container that had a red top with a white rock like substance inside of it.

On my dash camera when I originally pulled up on scene the same container is seen in Thomas's right hand, as I approached he shoved it into his right pocket. Cpl. Sumner advised me during the struggle she saw Thomas grab it out of his waste and he threw it towards to shack but then continued to resist and grab for his waste.

I moved all of Thomas's property to the hood of my car. I then counted all of the money seized which totaled out at \$444.00. Sgt. Futch then brought the bag of Marijuana and set it on my hood along with a silver scale. All of the evidence was placed in an evidence bag and turned over to Sgt. Hancock.

EMS arrived on scene and officers asked that they follow us to the Jail to check Thomas there due to the large, aggitated crowd that was gathering on scene.

Thomas's father had also showed up on scene and was acting very aggitated and aggressive, but there was not further incident.

I followed all units to the Cook County Jail where Thomas was checked and cleared of injury by EMS.

My department issued body camera was active for part of this incident due to the battery dying. My in car camera was active during this whole incident.

On June 15, 2020 at approximately 1900 hours I, Ofc. J. Brasher, just arrived to work at the Adel Police department for my shift, I and the other officers on my shift, were advised to meet in the parking lot by Sgt. Hancock.

I walked outside of the police department with the officers on my shift and Sgt. Hancock putled up. He directed us to come over to his car window to let us know what he had to say.

I was standing on the passenger side of his patrol car by the side view mirror and was able to hear him say that the FBI had a subject that they wanted to be picked up. The individual's name or nickname was said to be MoJo or KuJo or something to that nature. I was unable to hear everything Hancock was saying from where I was standing.

Hancock said that the individual was seen at a shack or something to that nature, on S. MLK Jr. Dr. and 6th St. wearing a black hat. The individual was said to be the only person wearing a black hat at that location. There was a few other people suppose to be there with him as well. I did catch something being said about this being drug related. I couldn't really hear all of the details due to where I was standing outside of the car.

Sgt. Futch was standing in the passenger side window of Hancock's patrol car and I did hear him ask Hancock if the FBI was going to be there. I overheard Hancock tell him that the FBI wasn't going to be there and that we just had to go pick him up. I also heard Hancock say that the information he was telling us came from Lt. Griffin. I did hear Hancock say that the county units were going to be advised of what we were about to do.

We all drove to the described location at S. MLK Jr. Dr. and 6th St. where the individual was said to have been. The county deputies that were on duty, arrived at the same time we did. My car was located in the back of the line of Adel PD cars and I parked it at the corner of S. MLK Jr. Dr. and 6th Street.

Lexited my patrol car and made my way to the "shack", which turned out to be more like a rectangular shaped gazebo, where the individual was said to be. Upon getting to the gazebo, I saw a black male in a black hat sitting to the left of where I was standing and three black males sitting to the right of where I was standing

Sgt. Hancock and Ofc. Greene were talking to the male in the black hat and Cpl. Sumner and I started talking to the other three individuals on the other side of the gazebo. I asked the two of the individuals if they had any identification and they stated that they did not. So I asked the individual in front of me what his name and date of birth was and he gave it to me. Cpl. Sumner gathered the names of the other two individuals that were The name he gave me was Calvin James Smith

There was also another individual wearing red that was standing in an area to the right of the gazebo, talking to the deputies about a motorcycle that was parked there.

At this point I could hear Hancock and Greene fussing with the individual in the black hat about being on his cell phone. Smith made a comment toward them saying that the individual could be on his phone and Hancock advised Smith to stay out of it. Smith wasn't being violent or aggressive, but I could tell that he was upset and when he spoke it was in a very loud voice.

I had my attention on Smith and then turned my head when I heard Greene telling the individual to put his hands behind his back. I then turned my attention back to Smith because he stood up, started yelling and seemed very upset. Hooked back over to where Hancock, Greene and the individual were, to see them struggling with him. As they were trying to gain control of him and were exiting the gazebo, I saw Hancock tase him in the back. At this point I had to turn my attention back toward Smith because he stood up and was yelling and upset.

Smith then exited the gazebo and the other two gentlemen got up as well. I didn't go over to where they were trying to put the individual in cuffs was because there were already enough officers over there. I stayed on the other side of the gazebo with the other two individuals and also was watching the area because a crowd was beginning to gather.

Due to the place from where I was standing, my view of what was going on was obscured by the railing of the gazebo. I walked over to where I could see, to make sure they didn't need any help, but all I could see was officers and then I saw Cpl. Sumner go over to the area behind where the individual in the black hat was sitting. I walked over to her and saw her pick up a small container that looked to contain a white powdery substance.

She sat the container on the top rail behind where the individual in the black hat was sitting. I then walked back over to stand by with the other two gentlemen that had been sitting in the gazebo. As I stood by with them, I was also watching the surrounding area as the amount of people that were gathering up, started to grow.

At this time, I saw the individual being stood up on the other side of the gazebo and he was in handcuffs. He was complaining about his arm or wrist hurting and at one point, went down to his knees as he was yelling. He was then picked back up and taken over to a patrol

A dodge truck pulled up not too long after that and Frecognized the gentleman that got out of the truck. Heft the two individuals, that I was standing by with, with the deputies that were standing in the area.

I made contact with the gentleman that I know as Mr. Rodney and found out that the individual that was under arrest was his son. Sgt. Godwin, with the county, had also came to Mr. Rodney's location. Godwin gave Mr. Rodney a brief explanation of what was going on. 7019184 20-06-00044

I then helped to transfer the individual in custody from Hancock's patrol car to Sumner's patrol car. After that I followed Sumner to the Cook County Jail and I was the one who took the individual out of Sumner's patrol car into the jail along side EMS.

The individual was then checked out by EMS before and after his handcuffs were taken off. Heft him in the care of the jail and after Hancock, Greene and Futch came into the booking area, Heft the jail.

Narrative:

On June 15, 2020 at approximately 1950 hours, I Sergeant S. Hancock was called by Lt. Griffin who advised me he had a tip that a subject, known as Charles Dunwoody (B/M DOE 178) (AKA Cujo/ Kujo), was sitting in a wooden shack with several other black males, one of which was Carl (Bobby) Kaiser (B/M DOB 1966), near the intersection of South Martin Luther King Jr Drive and West Sixth Street, and Dunwoody allegedly had several felony warrants, some of which Lt Griffin swore to himself, and was alleged to flee when dealing with law enforcement.

Lt. Griffin advised me Kaiser was supposed to be wearing a red in color shirt and Dunwoody was the only subject there in a black in color hat. I then called all Adel officers to the Adel Police Department and notified them of the information that I had received. We notified the Cook County Sheriff's Office of what we were about to do, asked for assistance, and went to the scene. Upon my arrival I spotted several black males, identified as Bobby Kaiser, who was in a red in color shirt as described, Ronnie Walton (B/M DOB 1979), and two unknown subjects sitting on the east side of the shelter, later identified as Gary Thomas (B/M DOB 1979), I made contact with Kaiser, advised him of why I was there and walked to Thomas, at which time I asked if he had a license or ID card and he said no. I asked for his name and date of birth, after advising him of why I was out with them, and he hesitantly advised me he was William Tomlinson (DOB 1979).

I instructed Corporal Sumner and Officer Brasher to gather information from the other subjects, who were sitting on the west side of the shelter, and while I advised dispatch of Thomas's information he picked up his phone and began to call someone. I asked Thomas not to call anyone to the scene and he said he wasn't but continued to make the call and even placed the phone on speaker phone. Corporal Sumner and I instructed Thomas several more times to stop calling and hang the phone up, due to the danger that officers would be in should a large number of people arrive on scene, but he would not comply and merely turned the speaker phone off. Corporal Sumner and I instructed him to hang the phone up and place the phone on the hand rail of the shelter they were sitting under but he still refused so I grabbed the phone, Thomas released it, and I placed it onto the hand rail and asked Thomas why he was having such a problem doing as he was instructed.

As I did so a large subject, who was at the opposite end of the shelter, on the north end of the bench, began to advise me that I could not tell Thomas to stay off his phone or prevent him from calling. As I spoke to the subject Officer Greene began to speak to Thomas. I heard Officer Greene instruct Thomas to place his hands behind his back several times and then I saw Officer Greene instruct Thomas to put his hands behind his back. Thomas would not comply with the orders Officer Greene gave so Officer Greene grabbed Thomas about the left wrist, continued to give verbal commands for him to put his hands behind his back, and Thomas began to physically resist Officer Greene by pulling his arm away from him and pushing Officer Greene away from him as Officer Greene attempted to place him in hand cuffs.

Because of Thomas's resistance and defiance my suspicions that we were dealing with the wanted felon. Dunwoody, became stronger. I attempted to assist Officer Greene but it was very difficult to grab Thomas due to my position, so I drew my department issued Taser and instructed Thomas to put his hands behind his back at which time Thomas pushed me back while he struggled with Officer Greene. I pressed my taser against the left side of Thomas's chest and delivered a drive stun in an attempt to convince Thomas to comply, but he continued to resist. A short time later Thomas made his way for the doorway and fell to the ground frying to get away. When he fell to the ground Sergeant Futch grabbed Thomas and held onto him, attempting to prevent Thomas from escaping. As he resisted Officers noticed that he was reaching his hands into his waist band, which made me fearful that Thomas may be trying to retrieve a weapon. As Thomas was on the floor I delivered several more drive stuns to his legs and shoulder area but he still would not comply. After determining that the drive stuns were not affective I holstered my taser while other officers subdued Thomas and I waited to jump in so as not to get in their way and so I could scan the other subjects for possible threats.

After Thomas was placed in hand cuffs he made complaints that his wrist was injured so I instructed Corporal Sumner to call for EMS. While waiting for Ems to arrive I began searching Thomas's false name through GCIC and NCIC to see if he had in fact given me the correct information. I sat my computer on the shelter hand rail to check the information and as I did so I noticed a small clear plastic container with a red in color lid on the rail next to my computer. As I observed the contents I noticed several clear baggies containing what appeared to be cocaine. I asked officers if they noticed it there and Corporal Sumner advised me that container was what Thomas retrieved from his waist band. Afterward he threw the container onto the ground near the shelter and she picked it up. As I looked onto the shelter floor Corporal Sumner then advised me there was a clear bag of green leafy substance under the bench that the other subjects were sitting on, closer to the north side of the bench.

Afterward I heard Officer Greene and Sergeant Futch instructing Thomas to get in the patrol vehicle. As they gave verbal commands I could hear Thomas being verbally defiant and refusing to get in the vehicle while also advising bystanders that he had been abused and beaten by law enforcement. I walked to Thomas and instructed him to get in the vehicle, advising him that if he did not comply (get in the vehicle) we would be forced to place him in the vehicle which could result in more physical control and force used on him and a short time later he sat in the rear seat of my patrol vehicle. Because I saw the suspected marijuana where it was located I begen to look around for the subject that was sitting nearest to that seat and I realized that he and Kaiser had both left the scene. I asked other officers if they knew where they were and they said no. While trying to work the incident and gether necessary information a large crowd of people began to gather and began walking onto the scene. I advised several of them that the area was an active crime scene and instructed them to leave but only some of them would comply. The crowd became more and more angry claiming we had begten Thomas which made it more and more difficult to conduct my investigation.

Because the crowd was growing the way it was officers asked if they could transport Thomas to the Cook County Sheriff's Office so that the scene would clear out but as they began to leave with him EMS arrived. Shortly after their arrival we decided that EMS would follow the officers to the Cook County Sheriff's Office and he would be evaluated there for officer and EMS safety issues. I retrieved all of the evidence/ contraband recovered from the scene and asked Walton and the unknown subject if the substances belonged to them or if they knew the subject that walked away and they said no. Because I did not see the subjects lay the substance down I decided to review body cam footage from all officers present prior to making a

charge on the subjects for being in possession of it so I advised them they were free to leave the scene and I advised all officers that I was leaving the

Upon my arrival at the Cook County Sheriff's Office Thomas was being observed by EMS. As they checked Thomas's wrist I asked what his name was and he advised me he was Gary Tomlinson so I advised him he told me first that he was William Tomlinson and asked why he lied. Thomas advised me he never gave me a name and stated he only said that he was not Charles Dunwoody. A short time later EMS advised him they did not see any injuries to his wrist and advised him it was up to him and law enforcement wether he was seen at a hospital or not.

A short time later I asked Thomas if he still wished to go to the hospital and he said yes so I attempted to call Chief Chad Castleberry but he did not answer. I called Lieutenant Griffin to ask him what they would wish for me to do and as I did Thomas advised Sergeant Futch that he did not wish to be taken to the hospital and asked if the jail staff would merely give him a Tylenol for his pain so Lieutenant Griffin advised me to turn him over to the jail staff for processing.

Because Tomas gave false names I instructed the jail staff not to release Thomas until his finger prints returned to verify his identity.

Thomas was turned over to the jail staff to await warrants.

When Sergeant Futch and I exited the jail Thomas's father was standing near the sally port where I parked my patrol vehicle so I asked if I could help him and he angrily instructed me not to speak to him and advised me he was within his rights to be there. I advised him I was not disputing that and explained that I was merely asking if he needed something that i could help him with. At that time two more female subjects approached us and began asking questions as to what happened and I did my best to advise them of what took place from my perspective. During the conversation Sergeant Futch asked them what Thomas's name was and they advised us he was Gary Thomas Jr. They advised me they wished to see the body camera footage of the incident so I advised them they would have to make their request with the Chief of Police the following day.

My BWC was not active for this investigation due to the battery being dead. I did not notice this until the incident was over.

On Monday, June 15, 2020 at approximately 1900 hours, myself and all other Adel PD officers on duty were advised by Sgt. Hancock to meet at the police department.

Upon meeting with Sgt. Hancock, he advised that Lt. Griffin advised him that an FBI agent passed on a tip that a subject (nickname "Kujo") was at the intersection of S Martin Luther King Jr Dr and W Sixth St, Adei, Ga 31620. The subject was described as a black male with a black hat. We were advised he was the only subject with a hat on in a brown shack with several other males. We were advised he had several felony warrants. I called Sgt. Godwin with Cook County Sheriff's Office and requested their assistance since we were told that this subject would likely run. The agreed and stated they would meet us there.

While we were in route to this location, Sgt. Hancock advised it was Charles Dunwoody who we were going to be attempting to make contact with. I was familiar with this subject's warrants due to a search warrant we had previously done at one of his known residences in the past (case # 20-03-00016). Once we arrived on scene, Sgt. Hancock and Ofc. Greene walked up on the gazebo to make contact with the male subject wearing the hat. Sgt. Hancock spoke with him and asked him for his information and instructed me to get the names of the subjects on the west side of the gazebo. The name that Sgt. Hancock ran through dispatch did not return on GCIC. While speaking with the other males (Walton, Ronnie 1979 & Walton, Randall 1977), I heard Sgt. Hancock instructing the male he was speaking with (later identified as Gary Thomas) to hang up the phone and not to call anyone. I noticed he did not put the phone down when Sgt. Hancock told him, so I again instructed him to hang up the phone. Myself and Sgt. Hancock told him multiple times to put the phone down and he refused. Sgt. Hancock instructed Thomas to turn the phone off and put it on the rail and again Thomas refused to comply with instructions.

During this time, another male on the west side of the gazebo got verbally agitated because we were instructing Thomas to hang up the phone. This other large black male wearing a black shirt (Ofc. Brasher identified this subject) stood up and told us we couldn't make Thomas hang up the phone. I turned to him and gave him multiple instructions to sit back down. While I was speaking to this male, Ofc. Greene and Sqt. Hancock were attempting to detain Thomas into handcuffs.

Thomas was actively resisting arrest and I could see officers were struggling to detain him. I went to assist with detaining Thomas. When I did, I observed taser lights on his torso area and waited just a moment before going hands on. Once I didn't see the lights, I began to try and pull his arm around to his back side. Thomas continued to pull his arm away from me and put it under his body when he was laying on the ground. He turned his body on his back and then back around to his stomach more than once while continuing to reach toward his waist band. While he was doing this and pulling away, I witnessed Thomas toss a small, clear plastic container with a red iid under the gazebo. The container had something white in it which I believed to be narcotics of some sort. I grabbed the container and tossed it out of the way to avoid evidence potentially being destroyed. Even after Thomas tossed the container, he continued to reach for his waistband, leading me to believe he could possibly be reaching for a firearm or some other weapon. I instructed Thomas to put his hands behind his back as we continued to try to turn him to his stomach.

Sgt. Futch instructed me to get my handcuffs and we were able to pull Thomas' right arm around to the back and I was able to get one cuff on. After other officers got the other cuff on, I got up to secure the container that I tossed.

Thomas made a complaint that the cuffs were hurting him and I advised him if he would calm down we would adjust them for him. He was escorted to the patrol car by officers and I stood by with Sgt. Hancock to assist him in trying to identify Thomas. Thomas continued to complain about his wrist hurting and at that time, I called EMS to come and evaluate him. The crowd in the area continued to grow larger and larger and family members of Thomas began to arrive on scene. Due to his incompliance at the time of his detainment and the crowd growing so rapidly, we asked EMS to meet us at the Cook County jail to evaluate Thomas. Thomas was removed from Sgt. Hancock's car and placed into mine for transport. As soon as I arrived at the LEC with Thomas, he was immediately transferred to EMS care. Thomas was released from EMS care to the jail staff.

My Watch Guard body/dash cameras were activated during this entire incident.

On June 15, 2020 at approximately 1900 hours I, Sergeant Futch, was called by Sergent Hancock and advised to meet at the Adel Police Department. He advised me that Lieutenant Griffin advised him that the FBI had a tip that a subject, known as Charles Dunwoody also know as Kujo was sitting in a wooden shack near the intersection of South Martin Luther King Jr Drive and West Sixth Street wearing a black shirt and a dark ball cap. He was supposed to be the only one wearing a dark ball cap. Dunwoody had several felony warrants, and we were advised he was known to flee when dealing with law enforcement.

Corporal Summer asked if she needed to notify the Cook County Sheriffs Office and ask for assistance for what we were about to do and I advised her to do so. At this time all Adel Police Department units followed Sergeant Hancock to the scene. I parked my patrol car and moved to the far South West corner of the property. I checked the shed from a back window and made sure the shed was clear. While I was helping hold the perimeter Sergeant Hancock, Corporal Sumner and Officer Greene approached the males on scene inside a gazebo and began to identify them. I held the perimeter until I heard Sergeant Hancock and Officer Greene continue to tell a black male with a dark half cap on and black shirt to stop calling people on his cell phone. This order was given to the man, later Identified as Gary Thomas (79), several times and he continued to grab his cell phone and attempt to make contact with people not on scene. I approached and took the cell phone off the banister and placed it on Officer Greene's patrol car in an effort to remove the problem and deescalate the situation. As I placed the phone on the car I could hear Officer Greene order Thomas to stand up and put his hands behind his back. Thomas began to resist officers attempting to detain him and I reached over the banister to assist.

After Thomas continued to resist I let him go and ran onto the gazebo in order to better my position to gain control of Thomas. At this point Thomas was swinging his arms and kicking at officers. I grabbed Thomas's legs and pulled him to the floor applying pressure to his legs to prevent escape of further injury of any party. After several seconds I noticed on open position on Thomas's back where I could help assist officers trying to cuff Thomas. While holding his legs Thomas had continued to kick me in the chest. I moved forward where I attempted to gain control of Thomas. Thomas continued to reach for his waist band and there was a fear he was going to a weapon. I was able to gain control of Thomas's right arm and had Corporal Sumner cuff it. I then took control of Thomas's left arm and brought it up to where Deputy Gatewood was able to assist me in cuffing Thomas. Thomas was searched after being cuffed and some money and a small amount of marijuana was found by me in his right pocket.

After Thomas was placed in hand cuffs he made complaints that his wrist was injured so EMS was called. Officer Greene and I adjusted the cuffs on Thomas to give him more room. Officer Greene and I then instructed Thomas to get in the patrol vehicle. Thomas was verbally defiant and refused to get in the vehicle. Thomas was yelling to a now formed crowd that he had been abused and beaten by law enforcement. After a short time we were able to get Thomas to sit in the back of Sergeant Hancock's patrol vehicle. A large crowd was growing and becoming agitated so it was decided to take Thomas to the Cook County Sheriff's Office where EMS would check him a safe and secure location. I stayed until all evidence was secured and officers were leaving the scene to follow Thomas to the Cook County Jail.

At the jail Thomas was observed by EMS and they advised him they did not see any injuries to his wrist. Thomas stated that he did not wish to be taken to the hospital and asked if he could just have a Tylenol.

Thomas was turned over to the jail staff to await warrants.

My body cam was active for this incident.

This case is cleared by arrest.

On June 15, 2020 at approximately 1900 hours 1, Ofc. J. Brasher, just arrived to work at the Adel Police department for my shift. I and the other officers on my shift, were advised to meet in the parking lot by Sgt. Hancock.

I walked outside of the police department with the officers on my shift and Sgt. Hancock pulled up. He directed us to come over to his car window to let us know what he had to say.

I was standing on the passenger side of his patrol car by the side view mirror and was able to hear him say that the FBI had a subject that they wanted to be picked up. The individual's name or nickname was said to be MoJo or KuJo or something to that nature. I was unable to hear everything Hancock was saying from where I was standing.

Hancock said that the individual was seen at a shack or something to that nature, on S. MLK Jr. Dr. and 6th St. wearing a black hat. The individual was said to be the only person wearing a black hat at that location. There was a few other people suppose to be there with him as well. I did catch something being said about this being drug related. I couldn't really hear all of the details due to where I was standing outside of the car.

Sgt. Futch was standing in the passenger side window of Hancock's patrol car and I did hear him ask Hancock if the FBI was going to be there. I overheard Hancock tell him that the FBI wasn't going to be there and that we just had to go pick him up. I also heard Hancock say that the information he was telling us came from Lt. Griffin, I did hear Hancock say that the county units were going to be advised of what we were about to do.

We all drove to the described location at S. MLK Jr. Dr. and 6th St. where the individual was said to have been. The county deputies that were on duty, arrived at the same time we did. My car was located in the back of the line of Adel PD cars and I parked it at the corner of S. MLK Jr. Dr. and 6th Street.

Lexited my patrol car and made my way to the "shack", which turned out to be more like a rectangular shaped gazebo, where the individual was said to be. Upon getting to the gazebo, I saw a black mate in a black hat sitting to the left of where I was standing and three black males sitting to the right of where I was standing.

Sgt. Hancock and Ofc. Greene were talking to the male in the black hat and Cpl. Sumner and I started talking to the other three individuals on the other side of the gazebo. I asked the two of the individuals if they had any identification and they stated that they did not. So I asked the individual in front of me what his name and date of birth was and he gave it to me.

The name he gave me was Calvin James Smith [188] Sp. Cpl. Sumner gathered the names of the other two individuals that were sitting there.

There was also another individual wearing red that was standing in an area to the right of the gazebo, talking to the deputies about a motorcycle that was parked there.

At this point I could hear Hancock and Greene fussing with the individual in the black hat about being on his cell phone. Smith made a comment toward them saying that the individual could be on his phone and Hancock advised Smith to stay out of it. Smith wasn't being violent or aggressive, but I could tell that he was upset and when he spoke it was in a very loud voice.

I had my attention on Smith and then turned my head when I heard Greene telling the individual to put his hands behind his back. I then turned my attention back to Smith because he stood up, started yelling and seemed very upset. Hooked back over to where Hancock, Greene and the individual were, to see them struggling with him. As they were trying to gain control of him and were exiting the gazebo, I saw Hancock tase him in the back. At this point I had to turn my attention back toward Smith because he stood up and was yelling and upset.

Smith then exited the gazebo and the other two gentlemen got up as well. I didn't go over to where they were trying to put the individual in cuffs was because there were already enough officers over there. I stayed on the other side of the gazebo with the other two individuals and also was watching the area because a crowd was beginning to gather.

Due to the place from where I was standing, my view of what was going on was obscured by the railing of the gazebo. I walked over to where I could see, to make sure they didn't need any help, but all I could see was officers and then I saw Cpl. Sumner go over to the area behind where the individual in the black hat was sitting. I walked over to her and saw her pick up a small container that looked to contain a white powdery substance.

She sat the container on the top rail behind where the individual in the black hat was sitting. I then walked back over to stand by with the other two gentlemen that had been sitting in the gazebo. As I stood by with them, I was also watching the surrounding area as the amount of people that were gathering up, started to grow.

At this time, I saw the individual being stood up on the other side of the gazebo and he was in handcuffs. He was complaining about his arm or wrist hurling and at one point, went down to his knees as he was yelling. He was then picked back up and taken over to a patrol car.
