On Monday March 4, 2024 at 2333 hours Officer Russell and Officer Holmes were dispatched to 628 Adams Avenue for a domestic.

On Monday March 4, 2024 at 2333 hours Officer Russell and Officer Holmes were dispatched to 628 Adams Avenue for a domestic. While en-route officers were advised the male half of the dispute was served with an eviction notice on today's date and was destroying property in the residence. Officers were also advised the dispute was physical.

Upon arrival Officer Russell and Officer Holmes spoke with the victim, Clara Bradshaw, at 620 Adams Avenue who stated she had her live-in boyfriend, Anthony Moss, served with an eviction notice today and when Anthony Moss received the notice he went out somewhere, consumed alcohol, and returned to the residence and started destroying property inside. Clara Bradshaw stated the argument never got physical and she did not have any visible marks or bruises on her. Clara Bradshaw stated she left her residence and went to the neighbor's house at 620 Adams Avenue to get away from Anthony Moss.

Officer Russell and Officer Holmes attempted to make contact with Anthony Moss at 628 Adams Avenue. While at 628 Adams Avenue officers heard noises in the wooded area to the left of the residence. Officers went to investigate further and located Anthony Moss in the wooded area. As officers approached the woods Anthony Moss began to yell however officers could not make out what he was saying. As officers continued to approach they gave verbal commands for Anthony Moss to exit the woods and show his hands.

Anthony Moss exited the woods while yelling and rushing towards officers. Officer Russell gave Anthony Moss commands to chill out and stop however Anthony Moss continued towards officers and walked past Officer Russell. Anthony Moss continued to yell "I stay right here" and "me and her go together" repeatedly. Officer Russell detected an overwhelming odor of intoxicants coming from his person. Anthony Moss spoke with slurred speech and staggered as he walked and rushed towards officers.

Anthony Moss was animated in his speech talking with his hands pacing pulling his pants up swinging his arms and smacking his left fist into the palm of his right hand while demanding that officers "lock her up too." Due to his behavior, intoxicated state, and refusal to follow instructions Officer Russell instructed Anthony Moss to place his hands behind his back. Anthony Moss put both of his hands up over his head instead of behind his back when instructed. Officer Russell reached up to place Anthony Moss's hands behind his back and Anthony Moss rapidly dropped both of his hands behind his back in what appeared to be an effort to comply.

Officer Russell attempted to place Anthony Moss in handcuffs while he was standing however Officer Russell was only able to place one handcuff on Anthony Moss' right wrist before he snatched away while stating "you ain't got to do me like that." Officer Russell used a balance displacement technique to off set Anthony Moss and put him on the ground. Officer Holmes and Officer Russell attempted to place Anthony Moss in handcuffs once on the ground but Anthony Moss still refused to comply, pushed up off of the ground, and was on his hands and knees. Officer Russell disengaged from Anthony Moss, pulled and activated his Taser and informed Anthony Moss he was going to be tased if he did not comply.

Officer Holmes was able to briefly get Anthony Moss back flat on the ground while Anthony Moss continued to struggle to stand up. Officer Holmes attempted to gain head and arm control of Anthony Moss on his left side but was unsuccessful. Anthony Moss stated "man you little" then pushed off the ground to his knees with Officer Holmes still on his back.

Officer Russell disengaged again and instructed Anthony Moss to place his hands behind his back again and when Anthony Moss refused to comply and made no efforts to place his hands behind his back, Officer Russell deployed a single Taser cartridge striking Anthony Moss on his right side. The top probe made contact with Anthony Moss in the approximate center of his ribs and the bottom probe made contact in his upper right thigh.

The Taser had the desired effect and Anthony Moss fell to the ground from his knees to the dirt in front of him. Anthony Moss rolled over once on the ground causing a clothing disconnect from the bottom probe approximately 3 seconds into the Taser exposure. Anthony Moss followed commands and was able to be placed in handcuffs with only a brief resistance after being tased.

Officers asked Anthony Moss if he was okay and escorted him to Officer Holmes's patrol car. Officers again had to struggle with Anthony Moss who refused to sit down or place his legs in the vehicle after being instructed to do so multiple times. Officer Russell had to arm his Taser and place it on Anthony Moss's left leg before he complied with instructions to put his legs in the vehicle. While at the rear of Officer Holmes's patrol vehicle an unidentified male who knew Anthony Moss also repeatedly told him to stop resisting officers. Officer Russell instructed Anthony Moss to put his feet inside the car over 15 times before he attempted to force him into the vehicle and ultimately armed his taser again.

After Anthony Moss was secured in the rear of the patrol vehicle Officer Russell went inside with Clara Bradshaw to observe the damage caused by Anthony Moss. Officer Russell observed a broken decorative glass jar that contained green beads smashed on the floor, a tri-fold partition that had been broken, and a white stackable plastic shelf that had been broken and thrown into the bath tub. Clara Bradshaw estimated the damage of all the items to be between 3-4 hundred dollars.

Officer Russell also learned that Anthony Moss took Clara Bradshaw's car keys and a set of work keys which contained keys belonging to the McDuffie County Sheriff's Office. Officer Russell recovered all of the keys and returned them to Clara Bradshaw on scene. Anthony Moss was transported to the McDuffie County Sherriff's Office Detention Center and committed.

Warrant were applied for and obtained on the listed charges. Officer Russell's BWC was active for the duration of the call. Officer Holmes's BWC was dead and charging at the time of this call.
