O R D E R



Before the Court is Plaintiffs' motion to stay. (Doc. 12.) Plaintiff requests a stay so his current counsel can withdraw, he can find new counsel, and his new counsel can determine how to proceed. (Id. at 1.) Upon due consideration, the Court **GRANTS** Plaintiff's motion. The Clerk is directed to **STAY** all proceedings, including all discovery and deadlines, in this case for **SIXTY (60) DAYS**. If Plaintiff has not provided an update to the Court or if Plaintiff's new counsel has not filed a notice of appearance in compliance with the Local Rules within the allotted 60 days,<sup>1</sup> the Court will take the pending motions to dismiss (Docs. 4, 10) under consideration.

<sup>1</sup> Plaintiff requests the Court stay the case for ninety days. (Doc. 12, at 1.) However, the Court finds a sixty day stay sufficient under the circumstances.
