Sir/Ma'am while on patrol in a marked vehicle I conducted a traffic stop that resulted in an arrest.

At or about 1530 a CNT agent requested a PCT Three Crime suppression Unit for a traffic stop on a Silver Toyota Tundra later identified with a GA tag of BQJ 1716 coming from the area of W.54th and Montgomery Streets. The agent advised that the vehicle was occupied by two subjects however, never disclosed the identity of the occupants. The CNT was in a unmarked vehicle and was unable to conduct the traffic stop. The vehicle left its location and was going North on Montgomery Street to an unknown location by officers. The CNT agent to my knowledge kept the vehicle in his eye sight while headed north. At some point another unmarked vehicle

being driven by APO Castro assumed surveillance. APO Castro said that at the intersection of Montgomery and Gwinnett Streets, the vehicle was in a turning lane to go West and continued North, unsafely driving through the intersection without slowing down or using his turn signal. I was advised of this traffic infraction which is an improper lane change. I attempted to catch up to the suspect vehicle that was still in sight of APO Castro and continuing North on Montgomery Street. APO Castro said he and the suspect vehicle came to the intersection of Montgomery Street and Liberty and had his right turn signal on to go East. I saw both APO Castro's vehicle and the Toyota Tundra stopped at a traffic signal. Due to the time of day, vehicular traffic was very heavy. I got behind the suspect vehicle and we both turned East onto Liberty Street. APO Castro advised me that the vehicle I was behind was in fact the suspect vehicle. I also verified the GA tag that was on the vehicle. Once safely onto Liberty Street I activated my emergency equipment in the 100 block of Liberty Street, about 300 feet West of Whitaker. I exited my vehicle and approached the suspect vehicle on the driver's side. The driver opened the window as I walked up. As the window came down I could smell a strong odor of Marijuana. Due to my training and experience, I could identify this as possible illegal substance in the suspect vehicle. I then asked for the driver's (Mr. Notto) and the passenger's (Mr. Johnson) identifications. I accepted the two subject's identifications and walked back to my vehicle to wait for back up. Once the back up was on scene OFC Knoop went to the driver's side window and APO Garcia went to the passenger's side window. I walked back up to the driver's side window as OFC Knoop was getting Mr. Notto out of the vehicle. OFC Knoop asked Mr. Notto if he had any weapons on his person. Mr. Notto appeared extremely nervous and tense when asked to put his hands on the vehicle. I heard OFC Knoop two to three times ask Mr. Notto to relax as he patted him down. As Mr. Notto was being patted down a plastic bag filled with an unknown substance fell from Mr. Notto's inner thigh. I then took Mr. Notto into custody as OFC Knoop collected the evidence on the ground.
