Narrative

Sir/Ma'am, Ofc Knoop (driver) and I were responding to back up Ofc Fikes whom was on a traffic stop at Oglethorpe Ave / Whitaker St. Upon arrival, I observed that Ofc Fikes had pulled over a silver Toyota Tundra which was occupied by two black male subjects. Ofc Knoop approached the driverside while I stood at the front passenger side window. I immediately observed the passenger (Mr Wesley Johnson) looking forward and breathing extremely heavy. His chest was going back and forth as if he was taking extremely fast and heavy breaths. The passenger would not make eye contact with me or Ofc Knoop and appeared to be very nervous. I could smell a faded odor of Marijuana coming from the vehicle's window which was closed. Ofc Knoop advised me on the radio that he could smell a strong odor of Marijuana coming from the driver's side window which was open while he was talking to the driver of the vehicle. I could hear Ofc Knoop ask the driver to step out of the vehicle which he did and then asked Mr. Johnson to step out. When Mr. Johnson opened the passenger side door I was immediately hit with a strong odor of Marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. I immediately advised Mr. Johnson to turn around and keep his hands on top of the truck facing away from me. As Mr. Johnson turned away from me, I could see a very large bulge right underneath the front belt buckle and slightly above the private area of Mr. Johnson. Fearing that he possibly had a weapon tucked in his waist band, I immediately grabbed Mr. Johnson's shirt and leaned my body weight against Mr. Johnson. I then checked if the bulge was a weapon and could feel that it was a large plastic bag containing a soft item inside. I then observed Ofc Knoop and Ofc Fikes taking the driver into custody. Fearing that Mr. Johnson might still have a weapon and uncertain of the situation at hand. I placed Mr. Johnson in handcuffs and retrieved the plastic bag in his waist line. I observed the bag to

contain several bags inside of it with a green leafy substance in each one. The substance appeared consistent with marijuana. I was unable to count exactly how many bags were in the large bag because I was concentrating on the suspect whom was now in handcuffs.

At that time, CNT agents arrived on scene and took interest in the case. I learned that Ofc Knoop found several types of different drugs inside another large bag which was found on the driver of the vehicle. CNT agents took custody of the drugs and had us transport the individuals to the CNT office in order to interview both suspects. CNT agents then took custody of both suspects and had the vehicle towed to their lot.
