# II. <u>POLICY OR PROCEDURAL CHANGES, TRAINING, RECOMMENDATIONS, AND/OR COMMENTS</u>

The department requires an investigation into the allegation that Officer Lionel Dely's personal vehicle was involved in a pursuit with Cobb County Police Dept where the driver was apprehended but the passenger fled on foot on August 14, 2019.

The investigation did not produce any factual evidence to indicate that Officer Lionel Dely violated the listed work rule as alleged. Cobb County Police contacted Atlanta Police Communications Supervisor making a notification that a vehicle (personal) belonging to Officer Lionel Dely was recovered after a brief chase which resulted with one of the occupants being detained and the second fleeing police on August 14th, 2019, at 1810 hours. Cobb Police reported that the vehicle contained Atlanta Police duty gear, but not the officer's service weapon. Officer Dely responded to the incident location and recovered his vehicle and equipment. Officer Dely was then relieved of duty pending an internal investigation.

Officer Lionel Dely stated that the last call for service he responded to the night before was a juvenile call where he recovered a weapon from the juvenile and required more paperwork than a usual call for service. Officer Dely stated that after completing all appropriate paperwork, it was 5 am as he is an evening watch officer he elected to stay at his mother's home in Cobb County rather than drive to his home in Adairsville.

#### **MEMORANDUM**

Officer Dely stated that after he got something to eat, he gave his car keys to Clint Saintvil (a friend of the family who is going through a hard time) so that he could move his (Dely's) vehicle from the front of the house to the rear of the house while he (Dely) went to sleep. Officer Dely stated that when he awoke, he looked at his phone and saw that he had 2 missed calls and another missed call from his mother. Officer Dely stated that he saw a text message from his supervisor (Sergeant McEckron) to call him asap. Officer Dely stated that when he called Sergeant McEckron, he was asked: "where is your car?" Officer Dely stated that he told Sergeant McEckron that his car was here (at his mother's). Officer Dely was told that his car was not at his location and while Sgt McEckron informed Officer Dely of the situation, Officer Dely went to where his car was supposed to be, he saw that it was not there. Officer Dely state that his mother called him hysterical as she thought he had been in an accident because the Cobb County police called her and informed her about his car. Sgt McEckron directed Officer Dely to call the Cobb County officer that did the traffic stop on his vehicle. Officer Dely was given the number to the (Cobb) VIPER unit and to call him. Officer Dely called the Cobb County Police Officer and was told how they came upon his vehicle. Officer Dely went to where his vehicle was located and recovered his vehicle and equipment after Cobb Police told him what happened. Officer Dely was informed that the driver of his vehicle (Clint) was able to get away on foot, but the passenger of the vehicle was arrested. Officer Dely cooperated with the Cobb Police officers regarding how to locate Clint. Officer Dely's duty weapon was in his duty holster which was on his gun belt, inside his mother's house. The equipment inside of his vehicle consisted of a raid vest ballistic helmet and raincoat. Officer Dely stated that he did not give Clint permission to take his vehicle off the property.

As a result of the investigation into Officer Dely's involvement and conduct in this incident, there was nothing gleaned that would indicate that Officer Dely loaned his vehicle or involved himself with a person of questionable character. Officer Dely's willingness to assist Cobb Police in locating the individual that fled from their traffic stop, is supportive of this assertion.

Based upon my review of this investigation, I recommend that the allegation against Officer Lionel Dely for the alleged violation of work rule <u>4.1.4 Conduct</u> be <u>Exonerated.</u>

- Any employee reporting for duty under the influence of any substance such as prescription medications, alcohol, over the counter medications, or other substances that, while legal, may adversely affect the judgment or performance of that employee during duty hours, must notify his or her immediate supervisor prior to commencing work.

#### According to APD.SOP.2020 Section 3.6, your rights as an employee are:

- All employees have the right to have an attorney or other representative present during questioning in an
  administrative investigation. However, any employee who is either an accused employee or a witness in a
  complaint investigation may not act in the capacity of representative for any other employee being
  questioned as an accused or witness in that complaint investigation. An employee's representative shall be
  allowed to consult with the employee, and to object to questions, but shall not delay or interfere with the
  questioning process. Any objections to the form or content of the questions will be noted, but the employee
  shall still be required to answer fully and completely any and all questions presented during the
  investigation. An employee cannot delay questioning for more than three hours beyond the time he or she
  was given notice to appear for the questioning.
- All employees will be issued a written statement (Form APD 848) of the allegations and the employee's
  rights and responsibilities relative to the investigation against him/her prior to any questioning.
- All employees who are subject to any form of discipline, whether non-adverse or adverse action, will be given written documentation of the disciplinary action taken. This written documentation must state the work rule which applies to the disciplinary action taken, information and/or documentation supporting the alleged work rule violation, and the disciplinary action that was taken. Employees must sign the written documentation stating that they have been notified of the disciplinary action taken. The employee's signature does not constitute an admission of guilt or wrongdoing, it serves only as receipt of the written documentation of disciplinary action and notification of the same.
- The employee against whom a complaint has been filed may review the investigative folder upon completion of that investigation. The OPS commander will designate the area where the folder is to be reviewed and establish rules governing the review of the folder.
- If the employee is being questioned as a suspect in a criminal investigation, the employee will be afforded complete Miranda Rights.
- Administrative statements made by employees and evidence gained as a result of such statements shall not be used against the employee in criminal proceedings involving the employee except in cases of perjury.

When Officer Dely called Sgt McEckron, he asked Officer Dely "where is your car?" Officer Dely told him that his car was here (at his mother's). Officer Dely was then told that his car was not at his location. While Sgt McEckron informed Officer Dely of the situation, Officer Dely went to where his car was supposed to be, he saw that it was not there. Officer Dely's mother then called Officer Dely (hysterical) as she thought he had been in an accident because the Cobb County police called her and informed her about his car.

Sgt McEckron told Officer Dely to call the Cobb County officer that did the traffic stop on his vehicle. Officer Dely was given the number to the (Cobb) VIPER unit and to call him. Officer Dely called the Cobb officer and was told how they came upon his vehicle. Officer Dely relocated to the scene where his car was recovered and was told what happened. Officer Dely was informed that the driver of his vehicle (Clint) was able to get away on foot, but the passenger of the vehicle was arrested. Officer Dely cooperated with the Cobb police officers regarding how to locate Clint.

Officer Dely was able to recover his police equipment that was inside of the car and nothing was missing. His duty weapon was in his duty holster which was on his gun belt, inside his mother's house.

# Regarding why he wanted his vehicle moved (when it was already on his mother's private property)

Officer Dely stated that all vehicles are parked in the rear of the home and not in the front of the home (where he parked his car after arriving home from work).

His mother's property is very large (note the Google map of his mother's address).

Regarding if Clint Saintvil had permission to take his vehicle off the property

Officer Dely stated "No".

On 8/14/19 at approximately 1730 hours, the VIPER unit was working the area of Atlanta Rd and Austell Rd. We were using a mixture of marked and unmarked vehicles as well as uniformed and plain clothes officers.

Sgt Bradshaw, Ofc Calleiro and I were in an unmarked vehicle on this date at which time we observed a black BMW X5 (GA tag# ENQ953) parked in front of Fair Oaks store located at 1238 Atlanta Rd. We observed two males seated in the vehicle as it was just parked in front of the store. We never observed either male exit the vehicle and enter the store. Upon the vehicle exiting we began to follow it at which time we observed the driver, Clinton Saintvil, fail to stop prior to the white balk line at the intersection of Carruth Drive and South Cobb Drive. I requested the uniform officers to come initiate a traffic stop on the vehicle.

Traffic was very heavy on South Cobb Drive. Upon Saintvil turning left onto South Cobb Drive; Ofc Scurr, Ofc Bethany Jones and Ofc R.C. Jones activated their emergency lights as they got behind the BMW. At this time, Saintvil turned right onto Westside Drive and rapidly accelerated. This is a roadway that has mobile homes on both sides of the roadway and typically has foot traffic this time of day. Saintvil failed to obey the stop sign at Westside Drive and Mobile Lane as he speed through the intersection recklessly at approximately 60 MPH. Uniform officers immediately deactivated their emergency equipment and did not pursue the vehicle in accordance with Cobb County Police Department policy.

Upon Saintvil coming up to the round-a-bout at Sandtown and Westside Drive, he failed to turn right as required. Instead, Saintvil turned left and drove on the wrong side of the road causing other motorist to have to get out of the way from being struck. Saintvil then continued down Sandtown Rd at which time I was able to see the BMW turn left into The Brix Apartment complex located at 16 Beech Rd, Marietta, GA 30008. I went to the other entrance/exit of this complex located off Beech Rd. Upon turning into the parking lot, I observed the BMW abandoned and the front seat passenger, Joseph Edwards, running directly toward the undercover car we were in. We also observed Saintvil running the opposite direction of us and entering the wood line toward Leader Rd. We exited our vehicle and detained Edwards without further incident. K9 arrived on scene and we attempted to track Saintvil but were unsuccessful.

Upon looking in the back of the BMW we observed miscellaneous gear that belonging to an Atlanta Police Officer. There was bullet proof vest, heavy vest, police radio and a police jacket. We made contact with the registered owner, Lionel Dely, and he advised he is an Atlanta Police Officer. He stated he gave his BMW car keys to his cousin, Clinton Saintvil, when he got off shift earlier this date. He stated Saintvil was only supposed to be moving the BMW to another location at his (Dely's) residence. Dely stated Saintvil did not have permission to take the vehicle elsewhere. Dely stated he opened up his home to Saintvil and his girlfriend in attempt to help him get his life straightened out.

Dely provided us with Saintvil's phone number. Edwards said Saintvil picked him up off Bellemeade earlier in

the day but said he did not know his name. I asked him for the phone number of the male that picked him up. He provided us with the same phone number that Dely had in his phone for Saintvil. Dely provided me with Saintvil's girlfriend, Carrisa Voss, phone number. I spoke with Voss and asked her when the last time she had spoken with Saintvil was. She said he text her and told her he was off of South Cobb Drive at 1750 hours. She said another text he sent her said he was near the Citgo and Lakefront Vista Apartments. This is approximately one quarter mile from where the vehicle was abandoned. Upon checking Saintvil through NCIC/GCIC I retrieved his driver license photo. This photo matches the description of the male I observed driving the vehicle.

Dely arrived on scene to take custody of his vehicle. The BMW is a push to start and the key fob was missing. He stated that Saintvil would not answer any of his phone calls. I asked for Dely to keep in touch with me in case he received any information on where Saintvil was. I spoke with Voss on 8/15/19 and she advised that she drove around looking for Saintvil the night of the incident but was not able to find him. She said she thought she noticed a vehicle following her home the night of the incident but wasn't sure. She said after arriving home Saintvil contacted her and she thought it was strange that he knew she was home. Voss said this morning (8/15) when she went out to her car, the key fob to the BMW was inside of it.

Ofc Calleiro secured an arrest warrant (19W8609) on Saintvil through the Cobb County Magistrate Court for; 2x STOP SIGN VIOLATION, DRIVING ON WRONG SIDE OF ROADWAY AND FLEEING/ATTEMPTING TO ELUDE.


