I was dispatched to the above address in reference to information. Upon arrival I spoke with Mary Dilg who stated her daughter needed to come home. Mary stated her daughter Christina Noelle Dilg needs to come home and is in danger. Mary stated in November of 2006 while she was in the hospital her daughter was taken against her wishes. Mary stated Christina went to live with her boyfriend and his parents in Flowery Branch, Ga. Mary stated Christina did not want to go and they took her against her wishes. I asked Mary how they took Christina against her wishes and she stated Christina did not have a car so she could not have packed.

Mary stated she now believes Christina is in danger because she is pregnant and her boyfriend has untreated Mary stated Christina is in danger and she wants to file criminal endangerment charges for Christina against John and Vicky Sullivan. I told Mary Christina would have to file the charges. Mary stated "no Christina does not have to file the charges she could file the charges" even though her daughter lives in Flowery Branch. Mary stated she wanted me to get in contact with Flowery Branch and check on her daughter. I asked Mary where Christina lives and she stated in a trailer in Flowery Branch.

Mary stated her daughter left the residence at the age of seventeen and is now eighteen and pregnant. Mary did not know the address where her daughter is staying.

While on scene Mary called her attorney, Jamie Cherry, and I spoke with her. I asked Jamie for information to help me understand what exactly Mary needed. Jamie stated she told Mary to call Flowery Branch Police not Cherokee County. Jamie stated Mary wanted to file charges against John and Vicky Sullivan for taking her daughter, when she was seventeen years of age. Mary stated this incident occurred in Dec. of 2006 while she was confined in a hospital.

I gave Mary a case card and informed her on how to obtain a copy of this report.

On 062607 at approximately 2230 Hrs. Mary Dilg called the Oak Grove Precinct requesting to speak with me. She wished to file a complaint against D/S Balckerby for failing to file a report for her. She also wished to complain that he used her cellphone to speak with her attorney, ultimately costing her cellphone minutes and money. Mary Dilg also stated that she did not appreciate D/S Blackerby yelling "have fun talking to internal affairs" while standing in front of his patrol car.

Mary Dilg then began to complain about how D/S Nash would not help her last week. She continued about Homer Kalb and how he was stalking her while he was inside our jail and how I should have arrested him instead of taking him to the hospital. I explained to Mrs. Dilg that I would not discuss that incident with her because she had already filed a complaint with internal affairs and the matter was under investigation. She began telling me about the federal lawsuit she has filed against us and how she is personal friends with Sheriff Garrison and that they sat on a board together for eight years.

Mary Dilg would continously interupt me while I was trying to speaking about the current issue, bringing up previous complaints she filed and how the deputies at Oak Grove precinct will never help her when she is a tax paying citizen. She kept threatening me with the law suits she was filing against the agency. I explained to Mary that she needed to speak with Internal Affairs about the previous complaints and not me. She finally told me specifically about the current issue:

Mary Dilg said that D/S Blackerby responded to her house when she was told by her attorney to call 911. She said that D/S Blackerby refused to file a report for felony child endagerment. She wished to file a report against the people that took her 17 year old daughter in, to live with them (against her wishes) while she was confined to a hospital last December. Mary said that her daughter is now 18, pregnant, has and lives in a trailer in Flowery Branch. She said that her daughter does not receive pre-natal care for the baby. Mary said that D/S Blackerby did not believe her and he used her cellphone to speak with her attoney. Mary said that D/S Blackerby told her attorney lies about her and she has witnesses.

Mary Dilg said that D/S Blackerby gave her a case number (I0759329) and then as he was leaving he told her to have fun speaking with internal affairs. She said that he yelled this from the street as he was standing at his patrol car.

I watched the video from D/S Blackerby's patrol vehicle. During the video Mary Dilg tells D/S Blackerby why he is needed and he begins asking questions (it was hard for me to hear parts of the video). Mary said that she needed a report so her attoney could file criminal felony endagerment charges. When D/S Blackerby begin to ask questions, Mary volunteers to call her attorney for D/S Blackerby. She calls and it appears she is impatient with the person that answers the phone. She tells someone about pending lawsuits against D/S Nash and the agency. D/S Blackerby speaks with her attoney. While D/S Blackerby is on the phone Mary is in the background telling D/S Blackerby that he is telling lies. D/S Blackerby tells the attorney several times that he is willing to file a report but he does not understand what it is that she wants exactly. After completeing the phone call D/S Blackerby continues to speak with Mary and she attempts to switch issues on D/S Blackerby by complaining about D/S Nash. D/S Blackerby stops her when she tries to change issues and completes gathering the information for the report. D/S Blackerby leaves and as he does so he turns his "mike" off but never stops in front of his vehicle. He then leaves.

Based on what I have seen I believe this issue is unfounded. Mary Dilg by her own admission has an issue with D/S Nash. Every time she speaks with someone from our precinct she tells us about her mental health, she is a tax payer and about the law suits she has filed against D/S Nash. I do not believe that anything said to Mary Dilg from anyone at the Oak Grove precinct will suffice.

Re: AIC on Deputy J. Blackerby

On 7-10-2008 at approximately 6:30 p.m. I spoke with Billie Seacrest in reference to an allegation on Deputy J. Blackerby. I spoke to Mr. Seacrest via telephone; I also read the incident report completed by Deputy Blackerby. I asked Mr. Seacrest how I could help him and he stated that he did not know why the Police were called. Mr. Seacrest is a 72 year old man who suffers from the stated that he invited the female teller to have a cup of tea with him because they were both from the state of North Carolina. He stated that he left the bank and did some other things in the area to include looking for a gym membership, going to Kroger, and other small things that occupied his time. He stated he went back to the bank to look at the used cars that were for sale at the bank. He stated that there was a black female walking in the cross walk and that he waited several minutes until she passed. He stated that the teller in the bank could see him but that he was not there to cause any harm. He stated that he was waiting until 6:00 to meet someone in the area. He stated that Deputy Blackerby spoke to him and that he was not courteous. He stated that Deputy Blackerby told him that he could not come back to the bank.

I explained to Mr. Seacrest that the bank employee felt uncomfortable with his actions and told this to the branch manager. The branch manager stated they did not want Mr. Seacrest back on the property. Mr. Seacrest stated that he did not mean to scare the female and that if she felt scared and called 911 then he understood why Deputy Blackerby talked to him. As previously noted Mr. Seacrest suffers from While speaking to him on the phone he began to tell me about his past, his family, and asked me several times who I was. I explained to him that I would view the video tape to make sure that there were no conduct issues. He advised me that would be fine and stated he did not want to be labeled as a bank robber. I spoke with Mr. Seacrest for approximately 45 minutes and while I enjoyed talking to him I could not find any validity to his complaint. I have requested that Sergeant Carmody review the video to make sure that Deputy Blackerby was courteous and forward me a copy.

I asked Billie what was going on with the bank and Billie stated nothing. I asked him why he was parked with his car facing the bank. Billie began rambling about going to the bank, looking at cars, thinking about joining a gym, and getting Chinese food to go home. I asked Billie what happened inside the bank and he stated nothing. I asked Billie if he had asked an employee in the bank out on a date. Billie stopped, thought for a moment, and then stated he was just joking with her. I asked him why he thought he was joking. Billie stated they had been talking about how they are both from North Carolina and "tar heels." I asked Billie if he was joking, why would the female think he was not joking. Billie stated he did not know, but he was joking. I asked Billie if he had been asked to leave the property and he stated no one came up and talked to him. Later in the conversation. Billie stated he had been asked to leave so he parked across the street. Billie stated he then walked back across the street and spent approximately 20 - 30 minutes looking at the cars for sale out front. I asked Billie if he had an account with the bank. Billie stated he has an account with another credit union that is affiliated with this credit union. I asked Billie how long he had been coming to this bank and he stated he thinks once a month for the past three or four months. Billie stated he only comes to the bank on the first of the month.

The bank manager, Ms. butler, came over and stated her employee was very uncomfortable along with other employees. The bank manager asked for us to give Billie a criminal trespass warning. I went back and spoke with Billie and informed him the bank manager asked us to give him a criminal trespass warning. Billie stated everything was being "blown" out of proportion. told Billie he was not to come back on the property of the bank. I told him if he does he would be arrested for criminal trespassing. Billie stated he understood.

Narrative

I responded to Credit Union of Georgia as backup to D/S Blackerby in reference to a bank customer that was inappropriate with an employee and was now watching the bank. Upon my arrival I observed a gold Infiniti in the Peking Tokyo parking lot across the side street from the bank. I approached the driver, Mr. Billie Secreast, and asked him if everything was ok. I noted he had a small piece of paper in his hand that was the size of a business card; he quickly placed it on the seat next to him when I knocked on his window. I noted that he had a clear view of the bank. Mr. Secreast said nothing happened at the bank today that he did visit there as he often does. D/S Blackerby approached and spoke with Mr. Secreast. I went to the passenger side of the car where I observed the piece of paper on the seat with the name. Marianna Bragg, written on it in handwriting. I then monitored Mr. Secreast as D/S Blackerby stepped away from the driver's side window. I noted that when the deputy stepped away Mr. Secreast quickly picked up the paper with Mrs. Bragg's name on it, tore it up and shoved it down the side of his seat. I informed D/S Blackerby of what I had seen. I stayed until he completed his investigation.

On 081011 at about 1800 hours I got a phone call at the Oak Grove Precinct from Mr. Clyde McCaslin. He told me he wanted to file a complaint against a Deputy "Blackberry." I asked him if he meant "Blackerby", and he replied, "Yes, that's him, Blackerby." Mr McCaslin went on to say that on the night of 080911 at around 2000 hours he was involved in an accident on Towne Lake Parkway. He said Deputy Blackerby was rude and unprofessional, and stated Blackerby "acted like an asshole." Mr. McCaslin explained that a young college-age female rear-ended his vehicle and Deputy Blackerby and his trainee, Deputy Holloman, worked the wreck. He said he had applied for a new license recently, and had not received the hard copy in the mail yet. He said he produced the paper copy the DMVS gave him for the officers when they asked for it. Mr. McCaslin said Deputy Blackerby was aggravated with him because of the paper license. Mr. McCaslin said he asked Deputy Blackerby if his license was valid, to which he received a reply that it was.

Mr. McCaslin said Deputy Blackerby then asked if he had a copy of his insurance card, to which he replied that he did not have it with him, but he had insurance. He said Deputy Blackerby questioned him about not having an insurance card, and he said, "I was under the impression that you could get that information from running my license plate." Mr. McCaslin said Deputy Blackerby got even more irritated with him, and made a comment something to the effect of him (McCaslin) not being legal and having the right paperwork. Mr. McCaslin said Deputy Blackerby then told Deputy Holloman to write the female that hit him a ticket. Mr. McCaslin said he protested that, saying that it was just an accident, and she was a young college girl without a lot of money. He said he did not think it was fair that she have to pay for a ticket.

Mr McCaslin said when he took up for the young woman, Deputy Blackerby turned all his attention to him. He said Deputy Blackerby asked him if he had been drinking. Mr. McCaslin said he told him he was only drinking tea. He said Deputy Blackerby started looking in his car, and saw a cup in the console. He said Deputy Blackerby asked if he could look in the cup, and Mr. McCaslin said he pulled it out of the car and handed it to him. He said after he was satisfied that it was not alcohol, Deputy Blackerby looked in his car again and said, "How many cigarettes do you smoke a day?" Mr. McCaslin said he did not think it was any of his business, but told him, "About two packs a day." He said Deputy Blackerby replied, "That's why you have ruined the inside of your car."

Mr. McCaslin said Deputy Blackerby then looked at his tires and said they were balled, and did not meet tread-ware depth requirement. He said Deputy Blackerby told him "The next time I see you, you better have new tires, or I am going to write you a ticket. I am going to pull you over the next time I see you, and if you have these slick tires I am going to write you a ticket and make you park it until you put new tires on." Mr. McCaslin said before he left Deputy Blackerby also questioned him about the numerous newspapers in his car. He told me he works for the Marietta Dailey journal and the Cherokee Tribune.

I told Mr. McCaslin that I would file the complaint for him and forward it to his supervisor. He thanked me for taking the call and we ended the conversation.

On Friday, 12 Aug 2011, I made contact with Mr. McCaslin in reference to the traffic accident he was involved in.

Mr. McCaslin stated he was rear-ended by a young female at about 30 MPH on Towne Lake Parkway. Mr. McCaslin had three distinct areas about the accident investigation he wanted to discuss;

1) Mr. McCaslin was troubled by D/S Blackerby's insistence to give the female driver of the offending vehicle a citation. Mr. McCaslin said the female claimed her parents were out of work and she was going off to college soon and lacked disposable income. Mr. McCaslin believed the citation was adding unneeded "insult to injury".

I explained to Mr. McCaslin issuing a citation for a motor vehicle accident in a situation involving an inattentive or negligent driver was completely appropriate regardless of the offending driver's financial status. Mr. McCaslin stated he understood the decision based on the criteria I provided, but felt bad for the young ladv.

2) Mr. McCaslin did not understand how it was any of D/S Blackerby's business how much he smoked when he was asked.

I explained the physical manifestations observed by Deputies on scene and how those manifestations could cause a prudent Deputy to inquire further as to the ability of a person to operate a motor vehicle. D/S Blackerby stated Mr. McCaslin was trembling even though he was uninjured and was chain-smoking cigarettes. · His apparent nervousness led D/S Blackerby to believe Mr. McCaslin was nervous about the Deputy's presence. Deputy Blackerby asked what was in the cup in the center console and was satisfied it was not an alcoholic beverage when Mr. McCaslin retrieved it for him. Under the circumstances, Mr. McCaslin said he understood why his trembling led to more questions about smoking and alcohol consumption and apparent nervousness and appearance of excessive smoking.

.3) Mr. McCaslin was upset about D/S Blackerby "threatening" to stop and cite him if he saw his vehicle on the road again without sufficient tread on his tires.

I informed Mr. McCaslin it would have been within D/S Blackerby's authority to prevent Mr. McCaslin from proceeding further until the unsafe vehicle deficiencies were corrected. Mr. McCaslin was informed his vehicle could have been impounded and a citation provided if D/S Blackerby had chose to do so. Once Mr. McCaslin heard the alterative possible outcome of the incident, he understood the stance on the issue D/S Blackerby took. Mr. McCaslin was reassured he was not going to be targeted for harassment by the Sheriff's Office.

Mr. McCaslin stated he in no way had any malicious intent toward D/S Blackerby. He did however want his side of the story heard and have the above concerns explained to him. Mr. McCaslin chose to withdraw his complaint.

- 1. Reference the AIC-Allegation on D/S Blackerby filed by Mr. David O'Neil on 10/03/2011 in regards to D/S Blackerby's conduct while handling a complaint about a remote control airplane being flown at J.J. Biello Park.
- 2. Mr. O'Neil's complaint consisted of two points: 1) clarification about laws and ordinances governing remote control vehicles in parks, and 2) an apology from D/S Blackerby.
- 3. In regards to the clarification of the law I researched state law and county ordinances at length without result. I extended my search by contacting both the CRPA Director (Brian Reynolds) as well as a state level radio flying hobby club.
 - a. No state or federal laws governing flight of radio control hobby planes were known.
 - b. Mr. Reynolds told me he had already been contacted by Mr. O'Neil and discussed an ordinance prohibiting "motorized vehicles" from being operated in parks. Mr. Reynolds said he believed the intent of the ordinance was limited to dirt bikes, ATVs, mini-bikes, mopeds and similar vehicles capable of carrying a rider. He specifically stated a radio controlled (RC) plane of the size in question was a toy.
 - c. Mr. Reynolds did tell me that CRPA had entered into a "gentlemen's agreement" with the flying clubs in the county. The agreement is the clubs will only fly planes in the parks when the fields are not being used for sports, citing youth sports are the primary intended use of the athletic fields.
- 4. In regards to D/S Blackerby's conduct and demeanor during his interaction with Mr. O'Neil I reviewed the in-car video from D/S Blackerby's camera. I found D/S Blackerby encountered an already frustrated complainant, Mr. O'Neil, and it appeared Mr. O'Neil was upset when he was told there was no enforcement action to be taken against the man flying the RC plane. Mr. O'Neil wanted to argue the point and tried to convince D/S Blackerby the RC plane was a motorized vehicle. D/S

Blackerby tried to be firm with Mr. O'Neil but due to Mr. O'Neil's frustration or personality, this seemed to encourage argument from O'Neil.

- 5. After leaving Mr. O'Neil a couple of messages, he returned my call and I was able to discuss the complaint with him. Mr. O'Neil was still upset and re-stated that his Lexus SUV was a \$50,000 vehicle that the RC plane was flying too close too. He also said the RC plane should not have been flown over the field where his son was playing football. I explained the limitations regarding the law and ordinance and that the opinion of the CRPA director, as well as my own based on review of state law, was that the RC plane was a toy and not a vehicle. I explained to Mr. O'Neil that the classification of "vehicle" is generally reserved for a conveyance capable of transporting passengers and / or cargo. Mr. O'Neil did not agree. I then explained that during my research I had learned of the gentlemen's agreement between CRPA and the RC flying clubs in the area and explained that D/S Blackerby was not familiar with such an agreement and while we had no authority to enforce such an agreement it would be appropriate to remind someone of it and politely suggest they follow it lest CRPA outright ban RC planes. Mr. O'Neil said he believed it was the responsibility of the Sheriff's Office to enforce all ordinances as well as being familiar with the various gentlemen's agreements throughout the county.
- 6. I asked Mr. O'Neil is there was anything further that I could do to help rectify this situation and he asked if the complaint would remain on file. I explained that it would as per out record retention schedule. Mr. O'Neil said he was satisfied knowing there was a complaint in D/S Blackerby's jacket.
- 7. It was apparent to me Mr. O'Neil did not like the information he was given by D/S Blackerby and was not going to be satisfied with anything less than what he wanted to hear.
- 8. I spoke with D/S Blackerby about the situation and suggested that he be more careful not to be baited into argument and to try to do so more tactfully. I also added that his frustration in dealing with Mr. O'Neil was understandable.
- 9. I believe based on my review of the in-car video and my conversation with Mr. O'Neil this complaint is Not Sustained.

On December 03, 2014 I received a complaint through the ASK System from inmate John Munroe stating that he had been the victim of excessive force. He stated that Corporal Kapanowski and Deputy Blackerby used excessive force on him to make an arrest. The complaint from I/M Munroe stated that the two arresting officers brutally injured his head, shoulders, hands, knees and wrists. I/M Munroe stated that after he was arrested the deputies made jokes about the force they used on him. I/M Munroe states that he wants to complain on the way the arrest was handled and he wishes to file formal criminal charges on the deputies that arrested him.

I looked into Tiburon and observed that John Munroe had been arrested for an outstanding felony probation warrant on the date the incident happened. I was informed by Lacritia Munroe (mother of John Munroe) that she had called the Sheriff's Office to report that her son John was at her residence and had active warrants for his arrest. She stated that she was not pleased with how her son was arrested. I had her explain to me her concerns and thoughts as to what the Deputies did or did not do correctly on this date. Lacritia stated that her son was asleep inside her other son's truck. She stated that Corporal Kapanowski walked up to the passenger side door and knocked on the window awaking her son John. She stated she watched from a window above the driveway while her son was talked with and she stated Corporal Kapanowski was standing in the doorway in what appeared to be an attempt to not allow John to run. She stated that he removed John from the vehicle and pushed his arms behind his back in what appeared to

be an attempt to hurt him. She stated that Corporal Kapanowski kept telling John to stop resisting and to stand still. She said that John could not hold still due to his arms being placed behind his back and being pushed up against the truck door. Lacritia stated that Corporal Kapanowski pushed John to the ground and began shoving his head against the ground. She said that this action took place for over ten to fifteen minutes. She stated that it appeared that Corporal Kapanowski enjoyed causing John pain. She stated that he kept pushing his head against the ground and trying to handcuff him. Lacritia stated that she began yelling toward the deputies that they are hurting John and to stop being so rough with him. I told Lacritia that I was investigating the incident and I might possibly have to call her back to get more information about the incident at a later date. She stated that she was glad I had called because she had a friend that knew Sheriff Roger Garrison. She stated that she was going to have her friend call him and she wanted to have a sit down with him about the incident and how his deputies handled her son's arrest. She stated usually when her son gets arrested the deputies are polite and friendly to her and John. She stated that during this incident she was told to back away and her son was mistreated by the responding deputies. Lacritia stated "I'm the one who called and told them where he was at". I'm not happy with the way the arrest took place. I told her that I would be investigating the incident and watching the patrol videos of the incident.

I had Corporal Kapanowski come into the Internal Affairs Office and I gave him a copy of his employee rights and read/signed the internal affairs warning. I spoke to him about the incident and had him explain what happened. Corporal Kapanowski stated that while talking with John Munroe he gave law enforcement his brother's name and date of birth. He appeared that he was looking for an opening to flee arrest. I asked Corporal

Kapanowski to explain this statement to me. He stated that his training and years of arresting wanted persons he has come to observe when someone is looking for an escape route. He told me that on this occasion John Munroe was acting very nervous; instead of concentrating on what questions he was being asked he was looking past the officer. He was attempting to find an avenue of escape from the question and physical custody that he was placed in. Corporal Kapanowski told me that once he told him to turn around and attempted to place handcuffs on John Munroe, he resisted and refused to comply. He stated that John would not allow him to place handcuffs on him and he did not want to let go of his wrist because he knew by John's body posture and his muscle tensing that he had become a flight risk. Upon this disclosure of the actions that took place Corporal Kapanowski told me that at no time did he use excessive force. Corporal Kapanowski stated "if anything he used less force than he should have, if he had used greater force at the first sign of resistance the action to gain control would have been quicker with less injury to the persons involved.

Second, I had D/S Blackerby come into the internal affairs office and I gave him a copy of his employee's rights and read/signed the internal affairs warning. I had D/S Blackerby explain what actions he was involved with on this incident and he explained what part he was involved with during the arrest. I was told by D/S Blackerby that he did not use excessive force and probably should have used more force to gain control quicker. I was told that when the suspect was being cuffed he pulled his hands out of the cuffs and went around on the ground trying to get away from the deputies and refused to comply with lawful orders or direction.

I watched multiple videos of John Monroe and how he was acting out during the arrest and while being transported to the adult detention center. John continued attempting to try and get out of the handcuffs and get free from lawful arrest. John continued to cause problems and take his seatbelt off and display his dislike for following the lawful commands the officers gave him. The video recordings show that, once the deputies got the upper hand and had control of John he would apologize for his previous actions. John stated "if I behave the rest of the way will you not add charges on me, I'm sorry but I don't want to go to jail or prison."

I contacted the adult detention center and had Inmate John Munroe brought to the Internal Affairs Office for a interview on the incident that had occurred. Upon his arrival I asked him if he wished to talk with me about his arrest that occurred on November the 30th 2014. I asked John Munroe if he had placed a request to talk with an investigator about his arrest and his complaint on how he was arrested. John Munroe stated he wished to talk with me about the incident and give his observations on how he had excessive force used on him. I had him describe the actions that occurred that morning. Inmate John Monroe stated "I was asleep in my brother's truck and a deputy woke me up." John Munroe explained that the deputy asked him to show his hands to him. Inmate Munroe disclosed that the second deputy opened the driver side door and unlocked his door, this giving the first deputy access to him. Inmate Munroe stated that the first deputy (Cpl. Kapanowski) opened his door and had him step out of the truck. He was placed in between the open door and the deputy. Inmate Munroe stated that he was cornered against the A pillar of the truck. Corporal Kapanowski told him to put his hands behind his back and then began to try and place hand cuffs on him. Inmate Munroe insisted that

he was not resisting and there was no reason to hand cuff him behind his back. Inmate Munroe stated that Corporal Kapanowski was pushing his arm up behind his back and telling him to stop resisting. Munroe stated that the deputy appeared to be enjoying hurting his arm because he would not stop and talk about this action. Inmate Munroe informed me that when the second deputy arrived back that slammed him on the ground and both of them laid on him. Inmate Munroe said that the two deputies slammed his head/face on the ground and continued to try and put his hands behind his back and hand cuff him. I asked him why not allow them to handcuff him and Munroe stated that he wanted to talk about this arrest and did not want to be handcuffed behind his back. Inmate Munroe stated that they rubbed his face in the ground for about 20 minutes and hurt his shoulder. Inmate Munroe stated that he wanted to press charges against the deputies and wanted them fired for these acts of excessive force on him.

I watched the videos and observed the majority physical part of the arrest and lasted just a little longer than two minutes. The only time that the three persons were off screen was when they went to the ground in front of the patrol car. Once the deputies were able to gain control of John the force was ended and EMS was called. EMS cleared him for transport to jail and John was upset and wanted to go to the hospital to get

Deputy Blackerby stated that during transport John began striking his head against the cage of the patrol car attempting to go to the hospital for the reason of having a concussion. After D/S Blackerby explained to John that he was going to jail and the nurse would be the next medical person checking him out for admission, John stopped striking his head against the cage. John then began to take his seat belt off and cause a visual distraction and safety concern for the transporting Deputy. On two occasions the

Deputy had to stop and place the seat belt back on the passenger due to John releasing it and moving around freely in the rear of the patrol car. Once John arrived at jail and was turned over to the intake deputies for processing he was only concerned about getting his medication.

Conclusion:

After all the persons involved were interviewed and the audio and videos reviewed it appears that no excessive force was used during this incident. John Monroe was actively resisting being arrested and was attempting to get away from the deputies that were there to conduct his lawful arrest for multiple felony warrants.

Therefore, there is no evidence to support a claim of excessive force against Corporal Kapanowski and Deputy Blackerby. Inmate Munroe failed to follow lawful commands and offered passive and active resistance. Once control was gained, inmate Munroe was placed in handcuffs assisted to his feet, then placed against the car until he was placed in the rear of a marked unit to wait for EMS to check him out for transport to the Adult Detention Center. Inmate Munroe freely admitted that his actions aggravated the deputies but he believes that his hands did not have to be placed behind his back. The evidence shows that the incident occurred and was lawful and proper. Therefore the allegation of excessive force will be **EXONERATED**.

I was informed by Cpl. Kapanowski that dispatch had advised him of a wanted male at 158 Farmington Drive. Cpl. Kapanowski advised he had contacted GCIC and they had two Felony probation warrants for John Marques Munroe of 158 Farmington Drive. Cpl. also advised me the Munroe subject was supposed to be asleep in a truck in the driveway. I met Cpl. Kapanowski around 121 Farmington Drive and we proceeded to the address. Upon arrival I parked my patrol vehicle on the street and proceeded to walk up the driveway. Cpl. Kapanowski was approaching the passenger side of the white Chevrolet truck. In the bed of the truck was a pillow and covers which appeared to have been slept in. I approached the driver's door and could see a male sleeping in the passenger seat. I unholstered my county issued Glock and had it at a low ready. Cpl. Kapanowski knocked on the window and the male awoke. We both gave verbal commands to the male to show us his hands. The male hesitated at first and appeared to be fumbling under the covers. I brought my weapon up, pointed it at the male, and again ordered him to show me his hands, at which time the male complied. I holstered my county issued weapon at this time. Cpl. Kapanowski told the male to open his door which he did not do. I checked the driver's side door, it was unlocked and I opened it. I hit the unlock button and Cpl. Kapanowski opened the door. I asked the male his name and he stated Chris Munroe. I asked if he was sure he wasn't John, he stated no he was Chris. I observed a black wallet in the door. I asked the male if it was his wallet he stated yes. I asked if the license in the wallet was his and he stated yes. I asked if it was okay if I get the license, he stated yes. I opened the wallet and pulled out the license of Christian Munroe 1987. I asked the male what his birthdate was and he stated picture on the driver's license did not look like the male we were dealing with. Cpl. Kapanowski advised me to make contact with the mother to make sure this was John Munroe and not Christian.

I went to the front door and knocked and rang the doorbell, no one answered. At this time I heard the male scream something. I ran back down to the truck as I rounded the corner I observed the male trying to get away from Cpl. Kapanowski, who was telling him to quit resisting. I heard something tapping on glass and looked up and the suspect's mother was knocking on the glass pointing towards the male and giving a thumbs up. As I got to Cpl. Kapanowski and John, I told him he was under arrest. I grabbed John's right wrist and attempted to put handcuffs on him. He began wiggling around, and I could not get a grip on his wrist. I told Cpl. Kapanowski to take him to the ground and we all three fell to the ground. I again obtained John's wrist and got a handcuff on his right wrist, as it was closing John wiggled out of the handcuff. Cpl. Kapanowski continued to give verbal commands to John to stop resisting. At this time John's mother, Lacretia Munroe came outside to the driveway and was yelling at us and John. I gained complete control of John's wrist and secured a handcuffs on his right wrist, and tightened it. I was then able to focus my attention and gain control of John's left wrist. I was able to get the other handcuff on John's wrist. At which time all use of force stopped. John's mother who was standing around us then stated you are John Marques. John was taken to the rear driver's side of my patrol car to be patted down incident to arrest. When we arrived at the back of my patrol car, and we were attempting to search him incident to arrest John attempted to run from us with his handcuffs on. We grabbed him by his arms and put him against the trunk of my patrol car.

While conducting the search incident to arrest of John nothing was found. I put John into the back of my patrol car. Cherokee County Fire and EMS, engine 7, came out to the scene to check on John. He had sustained abrasions, "road rash" to his hands and left side of his head during the struggle. Cherokee County Fire put a bandage on his head. While out of the patrol vehicle I checked the handcuffs and adjusted them. They were checked for fit and double locked, John was

put back into my patrol car. I then began transporting him to the Cherokee County Jail. While in transport John began hitting his head on the back partition of my patrol vehicle. My rear facing camera and audio were on during this. I told John to stop hitting his head, he stated he wanted to go the hospital not jail, because they will give him the hospital of the hospital. I stopped on Mill Creek Road at the bridge with Cpl. Kapanowski to put John's seatbelt on again, he had undone it. I put the seatbelt on him and began transporting him again. When I began going back on Mill Creek Road my video display turn to a blank screen and stated Record Error. I advised Cpl. Kapanowski we would need to stop and switch John over to his patrol vehicle, due to my camera system had stopped functioning. We pulled into the parking lot of Johnston Elementary, and switched John over to Cpl. Kapanowski's patrol car. We began going to the jail again and at the on ramp to I-575 Cpl. Kapanowski advised he needed to stop and adjust John's seatbelt again. By this time I was able to reset my video system and it was operational again. We stopped and Cpl. Kapanowski adjusted John's seatbelt. We continued on to the jail where John was released to jail deputies for booking.

John sustained scrapes to his hands and wrist area. John also sustained a scrape on the left side of his head in his hair line. I sustained scrapes to the knuckles on my right hand. The fingernail and skin were pealed back on my left middle finger, and scrapes to my elbows and knees. Cpl. Kapanowski had scrapes to his left knee. Photos of all the injuries were taken and will be put into evidence. I served John with his two felony VOP warrants and warrants for False name and date of birth, and Obstruction of Law Enforcement times 2 will be taken. I returned to service without further incident, nothing further.

I responded to 158 Farmington Drive with Deputy Blackerby reference a wanted person found. Dispatch advised Lacretia Munroe called saying a white male by the name of John Munroe was sleeping in a white truck in the driveway and he had an active warrant for his arrest. I confirmed two active Felony warrants on John Marques Munroe, w/m 1989.

As I was pulling up to the address, I saw movement in the truck so I pulled in the driveway. As I walked up the passenger side of the truck I saw a white male laying in the passenger seat and he was covered up with a blanket. I pulled my duty weapon, kept it a low ready position, knocked on the window and told the male to show me his hands. The male did not comply and was moving around under the blanket. I pointed my weapon at the male and he finally brought his hands out from under the blanket so I holstered my duty weapon. I told the male to open his door but he did not comply. Deputy Blackerby went to the driver's side and opened the door so he could make contact with the male. Deputy Blackerby asked the male if the wallet on the seat belonged to him and the male said it did. The male was asked his name and he said Chris Munroe. At some point Deputy Blackerby unlocked the passenger door and I opened it. I removed the blanket and placed it on the hood of the truck. Deputy Blackerby showed me the driver's license from the wallet and it did not look anything like the male in the truck. I told the male if he knew he could be charged if he was lying to us and he said he did. The nose of the male in the driver's license picture was much larger and wider than the male in the truck and his nose was skinny.

I asked Deputy Blackerby to try and make contact with Lacretia so she could identify the male in the truck. As I was speaking with the male, he appeared to be very nervous as his chest was moving in and out rapidly and his breathing was heavy. The male was fidgety and kept looking around like he was searching for an avenue to escape. The male wanted to get out of the truck so he could smoke a cigarette. Based on the male's physical mannerisms and the picture not looking

like the male on the license, I felt for officer safety it would be best to place the male in handcuffs.

As the male stepped out, I grabbed both his wrists and tried to place them behind his back. I started to tell the male he was not under arrest at this time, but once he felt his arms going behind him, his body tensed up and he tried to pull away from me. The male tried to turn to his right and break his right wrist free and I felt his body trying to go to the right to move past me. I attempted to regain control of the male by pushing him forward into the door jam of the truck door and the A pillar. The male continued to try and bring his arms to the front of him by twisting his body. I was able to apply pressure on his arms by bringing both of his wrists towards the top of his shoulders. I gave the male several verbal commands to stop resisting but he continued to struggle.

Once Deputy Blackerby arrived back to the truck, he grabbed the male's right wrist and told him he was under arrest. The male continued to move around and at one point I felt his body lurch to the left and I felt he was trying to re-enter the truck. Deputy Blackerby stated he wanted to take the male to the ground and the male was turned to the right and all three of us fell to the ground.

The male continued to move around on the ground to break free. I grabbed the males fingers and bent his left wrist back towards his elbow to apply some pressure so he would stop resisting and I put my right forearm between the male's shoulder blades and tried to control his upper body from breaking free by applying a downward force. I continued to give the male verbal commands to stop resisting. Deputy Blackerby was able to secure a handcuff on the male's right wrist and then his left. Once the male was handcuffed all force stopped.

At some point, Lacretia came outside and was yelling at us and the male. The male said to Lacretia "they think I'm John". Lacretia stated "you are John Marques".

John was helped to his feet and was escorted to Deputy Blackerby's vehicle. John would not comply to orders of standing still and spreading his feet apart so he could be searched for weapons/contraband. He kept moving around and I had to push against his body to keep him up against the car so he wouldn't break free. Once John stood still, I stopped pushing him forward. John then almost broke free and tried running away from us. John was grabbed and placed back against the car. Once he stopped moving, all force holding him against the car stopped. Once John was searched, he was placed in the back of Deputy Blackerby's vehicle. John's feet had to be placed in a hobble due to him thrashing around in the back seat.

John had some abrasions on his left temple area where he was moving his head against the ground when he was resisting and trying to break free as he was laying in the driveway. He had some abrasions on his right knuckles from the same altercation on the ground in the driveway.

Deputy Blackerby had some abrasions on his right hand knuckles and the middle fingertip on his left had some skin peeled back and the finger nail was damaged from the struggle to control John on the ground in the driveway. His elbows and knees had abrasions, his pants were damaged where his knees struck the driveway and he had blood on his shirt.

My left knee had a small abrasion on it and I had blood on my shirt.

I took pictures of all the injuries to John and Deputy Blackerby. Deputy Blackerby took pictures of my injury. These pictures will be placed into evidence at the Adult Detention Center.

Fire was called to check on John and Deputy Blackerby. Fire treated both John and Deputy Blackerby.

Deputy Blackerby started transported John to the Adult Detention Center and I followed him but we had to stop on Mill Creek Road because John had taken his seatbelt off. After we started

driving again, Deputy Blackerby advised we needed to stop at Johnston Elementary due to his patrol video malfunctioning. John was placed in the back of my patrol vehicle and we had to stop again on the on ramp from Sixes Road to I-575 northbound to re-adjust John's seatbelt.

On the way to the jail, John apologized a few times for causing us trouble. He said he did not want to go back to prison. John pleaded not to have any other charges and told me he was sorry for doing the things he did.

John was turned over to jail staff without further incident. This incident was caught on my in-car audio/video system. End of report.

On December 3, 2014 Lt. Sims received a complaint from inmate John Munroe that he was the
victim of excessive force. He stated that Corporal Kapanowski and Deputy Blackerby used
excessive force on him to make an arrest.

2. Lt. Sims spoke with Ms. Lacritia Munroe, Cpl. Kapanowski, D/S Blackerby, and John Munroe. All reports and audio / video pertaining to this incident were reviewed. The details of this investigation are outlined in the attached IA Case Report.

3. The findings of the investigation are as follows: There is no evidence to support this claim of excessive force against Corporal Kapanowski or Deputy Blackerby. John Munroe failed to follow lawful commands and offered active resistance during this arrest. Mr. Munroe actively resisted attempts to handcuff him and was then taken to the ground where he continued to actively resist deputies attempts to place him in handcuffs. Once he was handcuffed the use of force was discontinued against Mr. Munroe. He was checked and cleared by EMS and transported to the ADC. The evidence shows that the incident occurred and was lawful and proper. Therefore the allegation of excessive force will be EXONERATED.

Executive Summary and Recommendation

On Saturday, December 16, 2017, Ms. Kathy Graham filed an AIC regarding the unsafe emergency vehicle operation of Deputy David Moss and Corporal John Blackerby. Ms. Graham specifically alleged both deputies passed within her lane of travel on Hickory Road and nearly caused a head-on collision with her vehicle. A review of both deputies' patrol videos indicates Ms. Graham's allegation to be entirely false, as Deputy David Moss and Corporal John Blackerby never entered into Ms. Graham's lane of travel.

I recommend for this AIC to be Unfounded.

Supervisor's Comments

On Saturday, December 16, 2017, at approximately 1530 hours, I received a telephone call from a Cherokee County Dispatch Supervisor. I was requested to call Ms. Kathy Graham regarding the emergency vehicle response of two deputies on Hickory Road.

At approximately 1514 hours, Deputy David Moss had been dispatched to a traffic crash that involved injuries. This crash occurred on Univeter Road, at its intersection with Pine Crest Road. Deputy D. Moss responded Code-1. Corporal John Blackerby also responded Code-1. Ultimately, the Traffic Enforcement Unit conducted the investigation. One of the drivers involved in the crash was transported by Cherokee Fire/EMS for a neck and leg injury, along with lacerations to her face.

At approximately 1630 hours, I made telephone contact with Ms. Graham. Ms. Graham stated she and a juvenile were traveling in a red Toyota Camry on Hickory Road, in the vicinity of J.B. Owens Park (2749 Hickory Road). Ms. Graham stated the vehicles in front of her abruptly pulled off to the right shoulder of the roadway and she stopped her Camry in the roadway. Ms. Graham stated a Sheriff's deputy and a Holly Springs police officer passed in her lane of travel, nearly striking her vehicle head-on. Ms. Graham, several times, stated the emergency vehicle operation of the Sheriff's deputy and a Holly Springs police officer could have kill her and her passenger, and no emergency was worth placing the public in danger. I thanked Ms. Graham for bringing this event to my attention and informed her I would conduct a video review of the incident. I requested for time to conduct the video review, and Ms. Graham stated I could call her on the following date.

On Sunday, December 17, 2017, I extracted the patrol videos from Deputy D. Moss' and Corporal J. Blackerby's patrol vehicles. I reviewed each video in its entirety. I saw Deputy D. Moss was traveling westbound on Hickory Road; Corporal J. Blackerby was behind Deputy D. Moss. Both vehicles continuously used their emergency lights and sirens from time of dispatch until they arrived at the scene of the crash. Deputy D. Moss and Corporal J. Blackerby passed several vehicles during their response. All of the passes and traffic control device circumventions were compliant with Agency Policy 04-02-02, titled Emergency Vehicle Warning Devices. At no time did it appear that Deputy D. Moss and Corporal J. Blackerby were outdriving their ability to maintain control of their patrol vehicles. The two lane roadway was dry and the emergency vehicle operation occurred during daylight. The review of the videos did not indicate a Holly Springs police officer was involved.

I searched for the video segment containing Ms. Graham's allegation of unsafe vehicle operation. Near J.B. Owens Park, on Hickory Road, I saw Deputy D. Moss and Corporal J. Blackerby approached a pack of four vehicles traveling east bound. The three leading vehicles pulled to the right shoulder of the roadway. The forth vehicle, a red Toyota Camry, appeared to stop within its lane of travel. After locating the appropriate section of the videos, I found that Corporal J. Blackerby's patrol video to be most fruitful. At or about time stamp 15:16:49 in Corporal J. Blackerby's patrol video, I saw Deputy D. Moss was behind a white pickup truck, whose driver was failing to yield. At about this time stamp, the three vehicles could be seen yielding to the right side of the roadway and the red Camry appeared to be stopped in its lane of travel. Deputy D. Moss and Corporal J. Blackerby traveled past the red Camry and both initiated a pass on the white pickup truck. At no time was Deputy D. Moss or Corporal J. Blackerby head-on with Ms. Graham's red Camry. Furthermore, Deputy D. Moss and Corporal J. Blackerby maintained their lane of travel, except for when passing.

At approximately 0930 hours, I made telephone contact with Ms. Graham. I confirmed Ms. Graham's original allegation that two deputies were head-on in her lane of travel during their pass near J.B. Owens Park. When Ms. Graham confirmed, I relayed my observations that the deputies maintained their lane of travel when they passed her vehicle. Ms. Graham changed her allegation that the deputies were over the roadway's center line, and her complaint now surrounded a hypothetical argument of "what could have happened." Again, I informed Ms. Graham that her recollection did not match the videos. I offered Ms. Graham an opportunity to view the videos and informed her I would be available until 1700 hours this date. I provided Ms. Graham with the address of the Hickory Flat Precinct and requested she call 9-1-1 to relay what time she would be arriving. Ms. Graham stated it would be after she attends church.

As of 1700 hours, I did not hear from Ms. Graham. A review of both deputies patrol videos indicates Ms. Graham's allegation to be entirely false, as Deputy David Moss and Corporal John Blackerby never entered into Ms. Graham's lane of travel. For these reasons, I recommend for this AIC to be Unfounded.



RE: AIC-Code Response Driving by Blackerby & Moss

- 1. On Saturday 12/16/2017 Cpl. Blackerby and D/S Moss responded Code 1 to an accident with injuries. While traveling on Hickory Road they had to pass several vehicles. Due to the limited shoulders of Hickory Road there were times when motorists were not able to pull completely off the roadway, this required Blackerby and Moss to have to cross the centerline to pass vehicles.
- 2. Kathy Graham called 911 to complain that the responding patrol vehicles nearly hit her head-on in her lane of travel. She said the cars were from CSO and Holly Springs PD. Sgt. Carter obtained her complaint, reviewed the videos and believes her complaint to be unfounded. No Holly Springs PD cars are known to have responded, it is likely that she saw Cpl. Blackerby's black Ford Explorer and assumed it was a Holly Springs PD vehicle.
- 3. Sgt. Carter called Ms. Graham on the morning of Sunday 12/17/2017 to discuss his findings and offered her the opportunity to come to the precinct and review the video. She changed her allegation slightly and to the best of anyone's knowledge made no effort to arrange a time to review the video herself in spite of claiming she would do so later that day.
- 4. I reviewed the AIC and videos from both responding vehicles and found both drivers exercised due regard. The point at which Ms. Graham's red Toyota Camry coincides with D/S Moss having to place the driver's side tires on the center line so the work truck in front of him can see the emergency lights, there was too much equipment loaded in the bed of the truck for the driver to see anything in the rearview mirror and it appeared the driver was not responding to the siren. Once the work truck pulled partially off the roadway, D/S Moss and Cpl. Blackerby were able to pass and did have to partially cross the center line to do so. I believe they got closer to Ms. Graham's vehicle than she would have liked but I did not see any reason to believe the patrol cars were being driven outside of policy and training guidelines.
- 5. I called Ms. Graham today, 12/21/2017, at approximately 1230 hours and left her a message that I believed the complaint was unfounded and unless I heard from her I would forward the paperwork with that recommendation.
- 6. See attached AIC and supporting documents for further.
- 7. I agree with Sgt. Carter that this AIC should be UNFOUNDED as the conduct did not occur as described and was within agency policy.

- 1. I spoke with Mr. Mark Post because he was unhappy with Cpl. Blackerby's asking his stepson, the at-fault driver, what happened during a minor motor vehicle collision at Trickum Road at Barnes Road. His position was that Cpl. Blackerby shouldn't have asked the driver to make "incriminating statements". Mr. Post was very quick to point out that he recently lost a court case because he had himself "made incriminating" statements, presumably at another vehicle accident, and took the position that police officers should be able to determine what happened and who is at fault without asking "what happened". Mr. Post is of the opinion that Cpl. Blackerby was somehow violating the Constitutionally protected civil rights of the driver by attempting to get him to incriminate himself when no investigation was even being made into a criminal matter. He voiced his concern that Cpl. Blackerby also tried to enlist his aid in getting the driver's story about the collision and said he wanted to bring this civil rights "violation" to my attention in an effort to handle the matter in what he termed an "internal" manner rather than an "external" one.
- 2. Mr. Post then began making statements that he knows law enforcement officers in several counties, works frequently at the state capital "with the O.C.G.A." and has friends there, implied he has been influential in wording and/or passing legislation, and has won many court cases. He stated he lives in Cobb County, but feels certain what his friends, acquaintances, his "legal team" and Sheriff Reynolds "would say" about Cpl. Blackerby's unacceptable conduct (despite not even naming Sheriff Reynolds at the time). Mr. Post voiced his support for law enforcement officers, said he understands the dangerous nature of our jobs, but maintained his belief in the absolute right or a person not to be forced to incriminate themselves. The general nature of our conversation's opening seemed to be one of intimidation, in an effort to get me to agree Cpl. Blackerby shouldn't have asked the driver "what happened". I began to get the impression there is a Sovereign Citizen sort of philosophy in play here.
- 3. Mr. Post was apparently unable to successfully differentiate between the nature of a traffic accident investigation and a criminal investigation. I was unsuccessful in my attempt to point out that asking a driver what happened during an accident also offers a platform for introducing circumstances that may show a driver was not at fault, such as a medical emergency or events unknown to the investigating officer(s) unless they are told about them (such as animals in the road or the other driver doing something wrong). Mr. Post chose to argue that officers should be sufficiently trained in accident investigation and medical procedures to determine these things on their own, without driver input, or again, making "incriminating" statements. While debating with me, Mr. Post used the tactic of arguing with my answers following his asking questions. Likewise, I pointed out to Mr. Post that if the

driver in this case is sufficiently uncomfortable to give his account of the events in an accident, perhaps he should consider not driving at all. This attempt to get Mr. Post to listen to me failed and he began raising his voice, suggesting that our internal affairs investigators might need to look into Cpl. Blackerby's conduct or perhaps he should contact his "legal team". I informed him I would not agree that Cpl. Blackerby's inquiry into the accident was inappropriate, and that he is free to contact whomever he wishes.

- 4. Cpl. Blackerby, however, did deliberately drop the at-fault driver's cell phone on the grass after speaking with Mr. Post via speakerphone. Mr. Post began that conversation with a loud "What?" that was clearly recorded on the in-car camera system, and when Cpl. Blackerby introduced himself and tried to explain he was attempting to get the driver to tell him his account of the accident, Mr. Post angrily replied "That doesn't matter and you know it". Mr. Post told me that he also heard Cpl. Blackerby inform the driver he should not have dropped the phone, and apologize to the driver. Therefore, Mr. Post said he will accept that series of events and does not wish to make an issue of it. The driver also accepted Cpl. Blackerby's apology and stated the phone was not damaged. This has nevertheless been documented on an Employee Counseling form because it violates the employee Code of Conduct as is clearly spelled out in policy 01-03-02. Cpl. Blackerby responded positively when I spoke with him.
- 5. Mr. Post wishes to accuse Cpl. Blackerby of violating the driver's civil rights by asking him what happened. This is a standard practice of all law enforcement officers anywhere, and in all forms of investigations. It is true no one is ever required to make incriminating statements against themselves to government officials. But, asking such an open ended question also invites a suspect, or driver in this case, to make statements that may also introduce exculpatory evidence or intervening things which may remove them from suspicion of doing anything wrong. In addition, there is nothing contained in the Bill of Rights or elsewhere that protects someone from *being asked a question*. Mr. Post's anger over losing his own court case or his position that people shouldn't speak to police officers does not alter this fact, no matter how emotional or irrational he allows himself to become over it. In this case, the statements of the other driver and physical evidence allowed Cpl. Blackerby to correctly determine this driver was at fault and issue a citation for Following Too Closely.
- 6. Mr. Post's contention that Cpl. Blackerby violated the civil rights of a citizen by merely asking a question is preposterous, and does not even rise to the level of an appropriate civil rights complaint. It is my recommendation he be EXONERATED in that part of this investigation.

Division Commander Internal Affairs On January 16, 2022, I took a complaint over the telephone from Mrs. Lindsay Booth. Mrs. Booth was pulled over by Deputy C. England on Tuesday, February 8, 2022. Mrs. Booth does not have a complaint against Deputy England, but rather, Deputy England's back-up officer, Corporal J. Blackerby. Mrs. Booth advised the incident does not sit well with her about how she was treated and talked to. She also expressed how she does not like the way Cpl. Blackerby approached her and stood next to her passenger side door while she was seated in her vehicle. She told me she felt very harassed and was uncomfortable with the questions Cpl. Blackerby asked. She also did not appreciate the way Cpl. Blackerby leaned against her vehicle when he placed his arm on her passenger side door. Mrs. Booth felt that was disrespectful to her personally owned property.

On January 16, 2022, I interviewed Deputy Christine England. I supplied her with a copy of the AIC as well as a copy of the Employees Duties and Rights during an Internal Investigation. I read her the Cherokee Sheriff's Office Internal Affairs memorandum and the Internal Investigation Warning (Garrity Warning). Deputy England said she understood and signed both documents. Deputy England initiated a traffic stop on a black 2016 Chevrolet Tahoe bearing Georgia tag 5283 at the intersection of Highway 92 and Londonderry Drive. Deputy England initiated the traffic stop based off of articulable suspicion due to the driver failing to use a turn signal while changing lanes, as well as the vehicle's registration returning suspended. Deputy England explained the reason for the traffic stop to Mrs. Booth and later discovered the vehicle's registration was suspended due to a lapse in automobile insurance coverage. Deputy England advised the insurance was covered on November 17, 2021, but lapsed on November 18, 2021. Mr. or Mrs. Booth then reobtained automobile insurance on November 19, 2021. It was apparent to Deputy England that the insurance company did not notify the Department of Revenue once

the Booth's had their automobile insurance reinstated, thus the reason for the suspended registration. Deputy England told me she did not want to impound Mrs. Booth's vehicle and allowed Mrs. Booth to make arrangements to have the suspended registration handled while they were on this traffic stop.

I asked Deputy England if she requested back-up and she advised she did. She explained 2 Woodstock PD officers arrived on scene, but once Deputy England explained what was taking place, they went back in service. A short time later, Corporal Blackerby arrived on scene and assisted in the traffic investigation. Due to the circumstances of the vehicle's registration being suspended because of the insurance company's mistake, Cpl. Blackerby told Mrs. Booth they were going to allow her to drive up to the Racetrac gas station so she could finish paying the fines while being in a parking lot as opposed to the side of Highway 92. I asked Deputy England if she witnessed Cpl. Blackerby interact with Mrs. Booth and she said he did. She told me he was explaining to Mrs. Booth what she needed to do to take care of the suspended registration. I asked her if she saw Cpl. Blackerby place his arm on the vehicle and she said he did place his arm on the passenger side window. She explained that is something they sometimes do to appear less rigid. Deputy England said she does not think Cpl. Blackerby placed his arm on the vehicle out of disrespect, but more due to his relaxed state.

Ultimately, Deputy England used discretion and did not issue Mrs. Booth a citation for failing to use a turn signal while changing lanes. She also allowed Mrs. Booth the time to pay for the fine during the traffic stop because Deputy England did not want to impound Mrs. Booth's vehicle. Deputy England advised Mrs. Booth was very calm and considerate during their encounter and she tried to reciprocate those actions back toward Mrs. Booth.

On January 16, 2022, I interviewed Corporal J. Blackerby. I supplied him with a copy of the AIC as well as a copy of the Employees Duties and Rights during an Internal Investigation. I read him the Cherokee Sheriff's Office Internal Affairs memorandum and the Internal Investigation Warning (Garrity Warning). Corporal Blackerby said he understood and signed both documents. Once he was finished reading the accusation, I asked him what his thoughts were. Corporal Blackerby advised his interaction with Mrs. Booth was very cordial and casual. He said he explained to her what most likely caused her vehicle's registration to become suspended (lapse of insurance) and told Mrs. Booth how she could go about having the issue corrected.

I told Cpl. Blackerby that one of the issues Mrs. Booth has was him placing his arm on her vehicle. Corporal Blackerby told me he did place his arm on the passenger side door when he started to ask her questions about the vehicle, as well as if her husband was employed in law enforcement. Corporal Blackerby explained the blacked-out Tahoe very much looked like a law enforcement vehicle and he asked questions to confirm whether or not her husband was a law enforcement officer or a private investigator. He explained the Tahoe had blacked-out tinted windows, a push bumper and a laptop stand on the passenger side seat. Corporal Blackerby also advised the vehicle's tag had a seal of the State of Georgia sticker on it and it was obvious the sticker was placed on the tag after it was received from the Department of Revenue. He advised Mrs. Booth told him her husband owns several businesses to include a tree service company. Corporal Blackerby said he told her, "Okay, cool" and left it at that. I asked him why he placed his arm on the vehicle's passenger side door. Corporal Blackerby advised he was comfortable with Mrs. Booth and didn't feel there were any security issues with her. I asked Cpl. Blackerby if he placed his arm on the passenger door for the purpose of harassing or intimidating Mrs.

Booth. Corporal Blackerby stated, "No sir." He then explained how he made the decision to allow Mrs. Booth to drive up the U-haul or Racetrac parking lot because he knew she was on the phone trying to resolve the suspended registration issue and he wanted her to conduct that business in a more safe and secure spot than on the side of Highway 92.

Cherokee Sheriff's Office policy 01-03-02 (F) (6) states:

F. EMPLOYEE RULES OF CONDUCT: 6. COURTESY: Employees shall be courteous and professional in their association with members of the public and other agency members.

Employees shall be tactful in the performance of their duties, shall control their tempers, and exercise the utmost patience and discretion. In the performance of their duties, employees shall not use profane, vulgar, defamatory, or insolent language, drawings, depictions, or gestures toward another individual.

Deputy England initiated a traffic stop on a black 2016 Chevrolet Tahoe being operated by Lindsay Booth. Deputy England had articulable suspicion to conduct the traffic stop due to Mrs. Booth failing to use a turn signal while changing lanes. Mrs. Booth admitted to this investigator that she did not use her turn signal to indicate her desire to change lanes while driving on Highway 92. Mrs. Booth's vehicle's registration was found to be suspended due to a lapse in automobile insurance. Deputy England did not want to impound Mrs. Booth's vehicle as she is aware of how expensive that can be. Deputy England explained to Mrs. Booth how she could go about taking care of suspended registration during the traffic stop, thus allowing Mrs. Booth to continue driving that day.

Mrs. Booth told this investigator she did not like the way she was treated and talked to by Corporal Blackerby. She did not like the way Cpl. Blackerby approached her and stood next to

her passenger side door while she was seated in her vehicle. She told me she felt very harassed and was uncomfortable with the questions Cpl. Blackerby asked. She also did not appreciate the way Cpl. Blackerby leaned against her vehicle when he placed his arm on her passenger side door. Mrs. Booth said she felt that was disrespectful to her personally owned property. Upon review of Deputy England's in-car video system, Deputy England and Corporal Blackerby were nothing but professional and courteous. Deputy England supplied Mrs. Booth with the information needed to get the suspended registration taken care of during the traffic stop so Mrs. Booth could continue on with her day. Deputy England used good officer discretion by not impounding the vehicle when she had legal authority to do so. When Cpl. Blackerby arrives on scene, he begins to speak to Mrs. Booth through the opened passenger side window and explains the most likely reason why her vehicle's registration was suspended. Corporal Blackerby then asked questions about the vehicle and how it looks like a law enforcement vehicle. At one point, Cpl. Blackerby places his forearms and at times, his elbow onto Mrs. Booth's passenger side door. This was not done with the purpose of harassment or intimidation toward Mrs. Booth, nor was it done with the purpose of showing disrespect toward Mrs. Booth's property. Deputy England and Corporal Blackerby both showed compassion, empathy and acted professional throughout the entirety of the traffic stop. Therefore, Corporal Blackerby did not violate the Cherokee Sheriff's Office Code of Conduct policy, specifically Courtesy and this accusation is EXONERATED.

On 2/8/22 at approximately 1350 hours, I was driving eastbound on Hwy 92 near Professional Pkwy, on my way to meet with Corporal Blackerby to serve a TPO.

As I was driving, I noticed a black Chevy Tahoe that had the tag number "5283" with the Georgia seal on the side of the license plate. The Tahoe had a brush guard on the front bumper and black-rimmed wheels. The license plate was a Georgia standard alternate plate with a white background and a peach photo in the middle. The Tahoe appeared to be a police vehicle at first glance, much like how the Georgia Department of Public Safety Motor Carrier Compliance Division outfits their black Tahoe's. I originally thought it was a police vehicle but the vehicle didn't have any markings or agency lettering on the side.

Out of curiosity, I moved from behind the Tahoe to the left side of the Tahoe to look at the driver when we approached the red light at Hwy 92 and Main St. I saw a white female with blonde hair driving the vehicle and from what I could tell, she wasn't wearing a uniform. As traffic began to move, I merged back into traffic behind the Tahoe and continued on my way to meet with Cpl. Blackerby.

Once I was behind the Tahoe again, I noticed that the license plate had a registration sticker in the bottom right corner of the plate and I know that government vehicles are exempt from registration, so I decided to run the tag to see if it was a government vehicle or not. GCIC returns stated

While

I was running the tag, the Tahoe moved into the rightmost lane of Hwy 92, which merges into the left

lane directly after Hwy 92 at Main St. When the driver of the Tahoe realized her lane disappeared, she made a lane change directly in front of my vehicle and did not use her turn signal.

At this time, I decided to conduct a traffic stop for the turn signal violation and suspended registration. I activated my emergency lights around Hwy 92 at Londonderry Dr and conducted a traffic stop on the Tahoe, stopping east of Londonderry Dr on Hwy 92, on the right side of the roadway.

I exited my patrol vehicle and approached the Tahoe at the passenger's side window. I introduced myself, explained the reason I was stopping her, and requested her driver's license. I identified her as Lindsay Robinson from her driver's license. Lindsay was shocked to hear the registration was suspended and told me this was her husband's vehicle. I explained that I assumed she didn't know about the suspension and would try to find the reason why the registration was suspended by going to the Georgia Department of Revenue's website and checking the insurance status. I explained this website would give a reason for the suspension. I asked Lindsay to stay in her vehicle while I ran her driver's license and checked the state website. She advised she had a doctor's appointment at 2 pm, to which I apologized but told her to call them to let them know she would be late.

When returned to my vehicle, I noticed my video camera wasn't on, so I manually turned it on at this point. I began running her driver's license through GCIC and rechecked the license plate return. Dispatch then asked me to call them over the radio and when I did, he stated that he received a weird return stating I asked if he could send a Woodstock Police officer to back me up, just to have a second opinion on the vehicle. I attempted to check the Tahoe through the Georgia Department of Revenue website, but it continually wouldn't work. I went back to the Tahoe and informed Lindsay that the website wasn't working but I was going to continue trying, and I also returned her driver's license to her.

I then walked back to my patrol vehicle and decided to call Deputy Mills on the Cherokee SO Traffic Unit for a second opinion. He stated he wasn't at work so I called Deputy Hester, who is also on the Traffic Unit. He stated it was the officer's discretion as to whether I towed the vehicle but advised me to ask the driver about any "blue lights" that might be in the vehicle, due to the similarity of the Tahoe to a police vehicle. After talking with Deputy Hester, I waited in my vehicle for Woodstock PD to show up and continued trying to access the Georgia website.

Once he arrived on the scene, I updated Officer Hornes on the current information of the stop and asked him to just hang off to the side in case I needed anything.

I walked back up to the passenger's side window and spoke with Lindsay. I informed her that the website still wasn't working but would continue to try, and I asked if she had any blue lights or light bars in her vehicle. She stated that her husband bought the vehicle a year ago and outfitted it with the accessories after the purchase. I did not see any lights or light bars visible from where I was standing. I asked if she had ever been stopped by another officer due to the vehicle's similarity to a police vehicle and she said that she has never been stopped for this before. She informed me that the electrical box beside her head that was attached to the "B" pillar of the vehicle was the electronics for her "Biomat". She also told me that the laptop stand, located on the passenger's side of the center console, is used by her husband for work while she drives. I could tell Lindsay was nervous about the situation so I assured her that she wasn't in trouble and re-explained the reason I stopped her. I asked her to go ahead and call someone who might be able to pick her up if we couldn't get the situation handled, while I spoke with Officer Hornes again.

Officer Hornes and I both looked more closely at what appeared to be lights on the back of the Tahoe but at a closer look, we confirmed they weren't lights but were not sure what they were. I told Officer Hornes I was going to call my supervisor to get his opinion on the situation, but as I sat in my car for a moment, I decided not to bother my supervisor but to call Deputy Robles instead. Deputy Robles is a deputy who works with the Hickory Flat Precinct with the Sheriff's Office and a deputy I trust to make sound, rational decisions.

Deputy Robles stated he doesn't like to tow cars for suspended registration if he could help it, and I agreed with his judgment. I exited my vehicle and thanked Officer Hornes for his assistance and he went back into service.

I spoke with Lindsay again and told her she could park her vehicle in the turn lane of the property entrance directly in front of her since it was just an empty lot. This would avoid having to tow the vehicle and it would be out of the way of traffic. I also checked how far away the person picking her up was and urged her to call the tag office to pay the fine over the phone. I again went back to my vehicle and attempted to find the reason for the tag's suspension on the Department of Revenue's website.

While I was speaking with Lindsay, I missed a call from Corporal Blackerby, my corporal over the Warrant Unit. When I arrived back at my vehicle, I returned his call and I asked him to come out to my traffic stop.

I was able to check the website again while waiting for Corporal Blackerby. I checked the registration status at https://eservices.drives.ga.gov/_/. At 1418 hours, the returns stated the following:

I took a picture of the returns from the website and walked back up to the vehicle on the passenger's side. This photo has also been uploaded as an attachment to this report. I showed the returns to Lindsay and informed her that the suspension of the tag was due to a short insurance lapse from November 17, 2021, to November 19, 2021. I told her that if she could find a way to pay the fines now, her registration would immediately go back to active status and advised her to call the tag office of Cobb County. Remembering that Lindsay stated earlier that she had an appointment at 2 PM, I apologized for her missing the appointment and she stated "I would much rather deal with this than you tow my car".

Shortly after, Corporal Blackerby showed up and I updated him on what was going on. We first walked up to the tag of the Tahoe and confirmed that the gold Georgia seal was a sticker that was placed on the license plate. Corporal Blackerby walked up to the passenger's window and spoke with Lindsay as I stepped back to allow them to speak. He asked her what her progress was with the tag office and she said they wouldn't allow her to pay over the phone but could pay online and provided a website. Corporal Blackerby and I were both satisfied with her efforts so Corporal Blackerby told Lindsay that she was free to leave in her vehicle but urged her to pull into the RaceTrac right up the road from us and continue to try to pay the fine.

Corporal Blackerby and I began walking to our vehicles and he told me he was also going to go to RaceTrac to use the facilities and get lunch. Since we had to go serve a TPO together after he was done, I told him I would also go to RaceTrac. We told dispatch we were in service and began driving to RaceTrac.

A white truck was between Lindsay's vehicle and mine on the way to RaceTrac. When we arrived, Lindsay pulled her vehicle near the air pump on the left side of the parking lot, parallel to Hwy 92. Corporal Blackerby and I parked in two spots on the right side of the parking lot, directly in front of the store. We went inside for approximately 10-15 minutes and went back outside to our vehicles, where we then stood for approximately another 10 minutes, allowing Corporal Blackerby to finish eating.

I then noticed Lindsay drive from the opposite side of the parking lot, towards us, and parked in a parking spot to the left of my vehicle. She exited her vehicle and said she wanted to show us her receipt from the tag office for the paid fines. Lindsay did this on her own, we didn't require nor request her to do this. So, we thanked her and told her to have a good day, and I apologized again for the fact that she had to miss her appointment.

- 1. On January 16, 2022, David Barone began an investigation on alleged misconduct against Cpl. Blackerby.
- 2. Lt. Barone completed multiple interviews of officers within the department including Cpl. Blackerby.
- 3. The findings of the investigation are as follows:

 Cherokee Sheriff's Office Policy #01-03-02- (F) (2) states:

F. EMPLOYEE RULES OF CONDUCT: 2. UNBECOMING CONDUCT: Employees shall conduct themselves at all times, both on and off duty, in such a manner as to reflect most favorably on the agency. Conduct unbecoming shall include that which tends to discredit or cause the public to lose confidence in the agency or Cherokee County government; which is prejudicial to good order; OR that otherwise tends to impair the operation, efficiency, and/or morale of the agency.

Deputy England initiated a traffic stop on a black 2016 Chevrolet Tahoe being operated by Lindsay Booth.

Deputy England had articulable suspicion to conduct the traffic stop due to Mrs. Booth failing to use a turn signal while changing lanes. Mrs. Booth admitted to this investigator that she did not use her turn signal to indicate her desire to change lanes while driving on Highway 92. Mrs. Booth's vehicle's registration was found to be suspended due to a lapse in automobile insurance. Deputy England did not want to impound Mrs. Booth's vehicle as she is aware of how expensive that can be. Deputy England explained to Mrs. Booth

how she could go about taking care of suspended registration during the traffic stop, thus allowing Mrs. Booth to continue driving that day.

Mrs. Booth told this investigator she did not like the way she was treated and talked to by Corporal Blackerby. She did not like the way Cpl. Blackerby approached her and stood next to her passenger side door while she was seated in her vehicle. She told me she felt very harassed and was uncomfortable with the questions Cpl. Blackerby asked. She also did not appreciate the way Cpl. Blackerby leaned against her vehicle when he placed his arm on her passenger side door. Mrs. Booth said she felt that was disrespectful to her personally owned property. Upon review of Deputy England's in-car video system, Deputy England and Corporal Blackerby were nothing but professional and courteous. Deputy England supplied Mrs. Booth with the information needed to get the suspended registration taken care of during the traffic stop so Mrs. Booth could continue on with her day. Deputy England used good officer discretion by not impounding the vehicle when she had legal authority to do so. When Cpl. Blackerby arrives on scene, he begins to speak to Mrs. Booth through the opened passenger side window and explains the most likely reason why her vehicle's registration was suspended. Corporal Blackerby then asked questions about the vehicle and how it looks like a law enforcement vehicle. At one point, Cpl. Blackerby places his forearms and at times, his elbow onto Mrs. Booth's passenger side door. This was not done with the purpose of harassment or intimidation toward Mrs. Booth, nor was it done with the purpose of showing disrespect toward Mrs. Booth's property. Deputy England and Corporal Blackerby both showed compassion, empathy and acted professional throughout the entirety of the traffic stop. Therefore, Corporal Blackerby did not violate the Cherokee Sheriff's Office Code of Conduct policy, specifically Courtesy and this accusation is **EXONERATED**.

The board reviewed the automobile accident of Deputy Christopher Casey that occurred on November 16, 2013, where his patrol vehicle struck a privately owned vehicle on Arnold Mill Road near Ohara Drive.

Summary of Proceedings: The Board found, after examining the report by then Corporal C. Furman, the accident report, the in-car videos from Deputy Casey's patrol vehicle and the Corporal Furman's patrol vehicle, and interviewing all parties that the accident could have been prevented.

Deputy Casey was in the FTEP program at the time of the accident and on his 22nd tour of duty in said program. He has been on patrol with his FTO, Deputy Blackerby for 8 shifts. While Deputy Blackerby reports that they had patrolled Arnold Mill Road several times over the course of the 8 shifts, Deputy Casey states that he was not very familiar with the roadway and was not aware of the curve ahead just across the crest of the hill.

The roadway was wet from rain with foggy areas. Then Corporal Furman stated that he covered the road and weather conditions at roll-call advising everyone to exercise extra caution in their driving during the shift. Neither Deputy Casey nor Deputy Blackerby recalled this conversation.

Deputy Casey, with Deputy Blackerby, was dispatched to a residential structure fire with a report of persons inside the residence. The call location was 514 Penny Lane. Then Corporal C. Furman reponded as their back-up unit, with all three leaving the Shell Station on Arnold Mill Road near the Woodstock City Limits. The board took notice that there are 2 fire stations closer to the structure fire than these responding units, with one of those stations being between the units and the fire.

Deputy Casey's patrol speed reached 90 mph while then Corporal Furman, who is in front, is pulling away. The board found that the Corporal Furman's speed, given the conditions, contradicted his safety presentation from roll-call and likely created a greater sense of urgency in the mind of a less experienced deputy.

Deputy Blackerby was acting as the trainer for Deputy Casey at the time of the accident. Deputy Blackerby has held a position as an FTEP trainer for approximately 3 to 4 years and stated that he has likely trained 15 to 20 deputies in the program. Deputy Blackerby is heard during the response and prior to the accident coaching Deputy Casey regarding his speed, the conditions, his abilities related to the abilities of the Corporal Furman. The board took notice that Deputy Blackerby had a serious injury atfault accident with speed as a factor in January 2012. The board found that Deputy Blackerby should have recognized the dangers given the speed, experience levels, and road conditions and should have been more directive than coaching.

At the time the location of Mr. Keithley was unknown. Dispatch provided a possible address of 1903 Brittania Circle. D/S Halstead was en route to this location. D/S Blackerby was dispatched to 5216 Willow Ridge Dr in reference to a prowler. Upon arrival D/S Blackerby located a white male sitting in the back yard against the fence with his left wrist cut and bleeding. D/S Blackerby immediately requested fire/ems to the scene. D/S Blackerby was able to secure the cutting instrument and determine the identity of Mr. Keithley. D/S Blackerby made notification that he had found the missing suicide attempt subject. D/S Blackerby used a wash cloth to apply direct pressure to a three to four inch deep laceration on the left wrist of Mr. Keithley. D/S Blackerby continued to provide direct pressure to the wound until relieved by fire/ems. D/S Blackerby took immediate and positive action to save the life of Mr. Keithley without delay and without waiting for any other assistance which in all probability saved Mr. Keithley's life.
