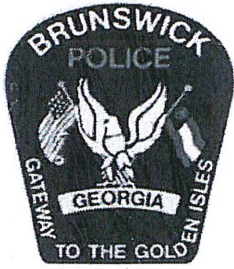

Chief,

On December 4, 2024, Brandi Simmon came to the Brunswick Police Department's lobby to file a complaint against Pfc. R. Sasser regarding an incident on November 10, 2024 (24BP32789) at 1806 Niles Ave.

In her complaint, she stated that Sasser responded to her address on Niles Ave to report that her son's ex-girlfriend (Saquyoai Hardee) had broken a window and wanted to press charges for the damages. She continued to say that she wanted to press charges but can't anymore due to having "lack of information" and that she is out of money because Sasser didn't do his job properly.

Based on my investigation and review of Sasser's Body Worn Camera, the incident report, and the complaint form, the allegation of Sasser not doing "his job properly", I am recommending this complaint be **UNFOUNDED**. Sasser conducted an investigation on scene with Simmon and later was made aware that the alleged suspect (Hardee) was involved in a Domestic Violence incident in the County's jurisdiction where she was sprayed by Pepper Spray by Simmon's son. Sasser conducted a follow-up investigation and interviewed Hardee during that incident.

Sasser was able to ascertain that an agreement between Hardee and Simmon was made for Hardee to repay for the damages, which was later acknowledged by Simmon on a subsequent follow up. It was notated in the incident report that Sasser was going to follow up with charges but then ascertained because a verbal agreement was made between the two parties, it made it a civil issue and he would not pursue charges. Simmon was notified of the situation.
