Your 61 statements, if truthful however, or any information or evidence 62 gained by your reason of your statements cannot be used against you 63 in a criminal proceeding. However, your statements may be used 64 against you in other administrative and/or disciplinary actions taken 65 against you. As such, you are ordered to answer all questions 66 truthfully. 338		absolutely clear that he has altered this video and fabricated evidence
339		to, to make inflammatory comments, or any inflammatory narrative,
340		that's been posted publicly and now in Officer Vanderpool's IA file
341		that, uh, I do think that's a little bit concerning and whether or not
342		his intentions here are, are, um, are genuine. I just would like to
343		point that out.
